

LITURGICAL MINISTRY TRAININGS

We will hold trainings for our Liturgical Ministries in church this month for all returning ministers and those who would like to begin serving as a liturgical minister.

Serving in the St. James Lector Ministry to proclaim the Word of God is an opportunity to take an active role in the liturgy. St. James Lectors are assigned to proclaim the first and second readings at all Sunday Masses as well as Holy Days, Ash Wednesday, the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday) and holidays. Liturgical Updates Effective the First Sunday of Advent (November 27-28)

Relocation of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

All communion ministers will serve from the front of the church. Christ is the bridegroom of the Church, and we as the Church are the Bride of Christ. It is important that as the Church, we come to the altar to receive and be made one with Christ. It is there, at the altar of sacrifice, where heaven and earth meet and we partake in the Eucharist, the source and summit of our faith. For those who are physically unable to come to the front to receive, our ushers will assist in making sure that a communion minister comes directly to you. If this applies to you, please make an usher aware prior to Mass.

Arrival of New Missal/Hymnal

A new missal/hymnal will be added into the pews alongside our current Gather hymnal. The Source & Summit Missal contains complete readings from the Lectionary for every Sunday, Solemnity, and holy day of obligation, reading synopses for Daily Mass, and antiphons from the English translation of the Roman Missal and Graduale Romanum. The core repertoire of the Source & Summit Missal are time-tested and theologically reliable English hymns and a collection of hymns from the Liturgy of the Hours set to familiar tunes. We are excited to introduce this new resource to our parish! Please note that in addition to the Source & Summit Missal, we will continue to utilize our Gather hymnal and maintain our robust contemporary music catalogue.

Return of Collection Baskets

Collection baskets will return as a visible sign of our commitment to stewardship and our passion for serving this community. Baskets will be passed as have been done in the past and donation boxes will remain at the entrances to the church.

Addition of Organ to Sunday 7:00am Mass



VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR SENIOR TAX PREPARATION

AARP Tax-Aide is looking for volunteers to help seniors in the northwest suburbs with federal and state tax preparation.

No previous tax experience is necessary but good computer skills are required.

Those who volunteer receive IRS training materials and may attend 4-5 weekday training classes. They must satisfactorily complete a test to become IRS-certified tax preparers. Volunteers must be able to commit to 3-4 hours once a week during the tax season, February – April, 2022.

WEEKLY INTENTIONS

CHANGES COMING TO MASS INTENTIONS: On January 1, 2022 we will be making changes to our mass intentions. Four take-aways to keep in mind:

- 2.) No more than four intentions will be remembered at Sunday masses. Sunday intentions will be assigned to a specific mass as requested.
- 3.) Mass intentions are a free-will donation, but it's customary to donate \$10/mass.
- 4.) Request an intention at least two weeks ahead of time for a specific date.
