FORMING DISCIPLES

Refections for Advent from the Women of St. James

Joy by Anne McClure

We hear so many calls to joy in Scripture that we know it must be important. Jesus himself says in John 15, "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you, and your joy may be complete." Our Lord wants us to feel joy, but how can we get there?

I think the answer to that question lies in the difference between natural joy and supernatural joy. Human suffering can diminish natural joy; but God wants to give us the supernatural kind. According to



C.S. Lewis, "joy, in the supernatural order, is simply an aspect of charity. It is inseparable from the love that is poured forth in our hearts by the Holy Ghost." Supernatural joy, then, is enkindled in us by the Holy Spirit.



So what are three practical things we can do to experience this supernatural joy? First, we need to take care of the natural, because the supernatural builds on it. St. Thomas Aquinas said: "Sorrow can be alleviated by good sleep, a bath, and a glass of wine." If I'm lacking joy, am I just too exhausted? How can I build a healthy mental and physical foundation for supernatural joy?

Second, remember Jesus's words in John 15. Just before, he says "Remain in me." How do we, as Catholics, remain in Christ? Through the sacraments. The sacraments are the source of that supernatural joy. Even if we don't always feel it, we know that the sacraments are channels of grace, and when we receive them we receive God's life within us. This Advent, how can I remain close to Jesus in the sacraments? When was my last confession? Have I ever tried going to daily mass or visiting the adoration chapel?

Finally, have I asked for this joy? We can ask Jesus to pour it out, and we can ask Our Lady, "Cause of Our Joy," to pray for us to receive the joy of bearing Christ into the world as she did.



MEETING MENTAL HEALTH WITH GRACE

It's the most wonderful time of the year. Yet, for many of us, it's the *most stressful* time of the year. Here are 3 things to try when stress creeps up on you.

1. Pause to Pray.

Treat stress or worry as a signal to pray. Take 15 seconds and *pray*. When you do, "the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds." (Philippians 4:7)

2. Time for Thanks.

Every time you feel worry or stress, take 5 or 10 seconds just to **thank God** for the answer you need. Prayer with thanksgiving is powerful!

3. Be a Blessing.

The world of the generous gets larger and larger... (Proverbs 11:24). Finding someone to **bless** with a small note or encouraging word puts life in proper perspective.

A simple *prayer*, a word of *thanks*, or an act of *generosity* are three amazing tools against worry and stress. Use them often. God's peace flows abundantly through these mighty forces.
