Dear Parishioners,

God sure made it easy to celebrate the Resurrection last weekend with the glorious weather we had! I'm not sure we could have asked for a more perfect day. Whether we worshipped in the church, the parish center, the parking lot, or our home, I hope that we all felt the joy of being redeemed and called into risen life. I, for one, was overjoyed to be celebrating this high holy day with people and not just in front of a camera.



Maybe I can use all that excitement and energy as an excuse for a major oversight on my part during the 8:30am Sunday Mass. There I told a story of how I once was on pilgrimage to Rome and was invited to play the organ in St. Peter's Basilica right before Mass was to begin. I relayed that halfway through the piece I was playing I was abruptly pushed off the organ bench by a (dramatic) Vatican musician. But apparently I left all you 8:30'ers on a chord of suspense that was never resolved: Why was I pushed off the bench?

It wasn't my intention to leave you guessing, though I did have to laugh that it could have been the spirit of St. Mark overtaking me in the moment. (You'll remember that Mark likes unresolved suspense, since his original ending (Mk 16:8) leaves us with a huge cliffhanger.)

Well, in case the suspense has been killing you this past week (low probability, I know), let me offer a word of resolution. It wasn't because I was hitting wrong notes that I was shoved off the bench, though those wrong notes were definitely there. It's simply because the basilica decided to start Mass a few minutes early in order to clear us out before the next liturgy began. If you were wondering whether they gave us time for coffee and donuts, well, I'll keep you guessing on that one.

On that note, I do want to offer my thanks to everyone who had a hand in making our Holy Week liturgies run smoothly, reverently, and joyfully. Our musicians, liturgists, RCIA team, art & environment crew, ushers, liturgical ministers, and staff all put in a huge amount of effort to ensure that we would have a well-organized yet prayerful Holy Week. I'm proud that we gave people much more than a St. Peter's Basilica welcome. Please accept my profound gratitude for all that you do to make St. James a wonderful place to grow and serve.






