ELEVENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

This weekend is already shaping up to be a fantastic weekend. We've received the green light from the Archdiocese to open the church to 100% capacity for this weekend's liturgies, which means that we will no longer be asking you to register for Mass! The Archdiocese has informed us that those who are vaccinated will no longer need to wear masks during church, but they're still asking that unvaccinated people wear masks. We won't be checking this status but ask that parishioners abide by this on the honor system.

MESSAGE FROM...

The pandemic is gradually coming to an end– thanks be to God! As we emerge from what we pray is a once-in-a-lifetime situation, it's fitting first to give thanks to God that this day is finally here. But we also owe a tremendous amount of thanks to the many people who displayed true dedication, creativity, and generosity throughout the past year or so.

Of course, there's no shortage of thanks owed to you parishioners who humbly but generously continued to support St. James financially. That our weekly collections have remained stable even better than estimated!—is a testament to the love you show the community and to what I hope you feel is a deep love felt for you in return. And your generosity in last June's tuition appeal (to the tune of \$116,880) ensured that many faced with greater financial stress over the past year were able to receive quality formation in our school and religious education program. Virtually, all of these funds were used by SJS and RE families.

Amid the constant change and uncertainty, St. James School educated 515 students this past year and is slated to do so for 565 kids in a more "normal" environment next year. That simply would not have been possible without the hard work and cooperation of our faculty, staff, and parents. Students in RE Grades 1-8 numbered 540. Many parents took a more active role in forming their children through home-school programs

and small groups, and for their initiative and their collaboration with our Evangelization Team, we're not only inspired but also very grateful.

In addition, the pandemic regulations demanded a lot of time and energy from parish volunteers, especially earlier on when we needed more greeters, ushers, and cleaners (colloquially and collectively known as GUCs). Thank you for stepping up to help get us to this point.

Finally, thank you for your patience in the yearlong marathon to this weekend's milestone. I know that along the way there have been different opinions about regulations, frustrations about the Church's course of action, and some feelings of anxiety over what would be happening next, among other things.

As we emerge from this critical point in our life together, I hope that we do so by celebrating all the good things that have come to life in the past 15 months. At the same time, I hope we will learn from our experience so that we might continue to grow in our capacity to love and serve our neighbors, in good times and in bad, through sickness and health, as long as we all shall live.

Racism and Education



Third in a series of nine USCCB backgrounders on racism and systemic racism, wealth, education, employment, housing, migration, criminal justice, the Native American experience, and voting. Combatting Racism - Parish Resources / USCCB

During the Civil Rights Movement of the late 1950s and the 60s, school desegregation was a major issue, causing bitter, sometimes violent, struggles. In 1954, the Supreme Court ruled in Brown v Board of Education of Topeka that all U.S. schools be integrated. Regrettably, recent studies have shown that after initial gains, schools are now as segregated as they were before the Brown decision. Today in schools located in high poverty areas, the majority of the students are African American, Hispanic and Latino. Because public schools chiefly depend on local real estate taxes for funding, schools in areas with high housing values can offer more to students, often leaving many minority students out of the equation.

The U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights has studied the critical gaps of these unequitable funding structures. The recent data from that office shows consistent problems for minority students:

- · Limited access to early learning
- Lack of teacher equity
- Limited access to courses and programs that lead to college and career readiness
- Low rates of teacher retention
- Schools on Native American reservations face a host of additional barriers to student success.


