



Memorial Day. Much different than Veterans Day.

The sacrifices that people have made, and continue to make, serving in defense of this country are incredible. Some leave family behind for weeks, months, and even years. Sadly, some do not return from their service. They lay down their lives for all of us.



On Memorial Day we remember those who have died in service to our great country. Usually a festive day with parades, speeches, and sometimes even 21-gun salutes. Memorial Day is sometimes referred to as the start of summer. But Memorial Day should be about more than backyard barbecues and a three-day weekend.

Although people tend to wish others, especially Veterans, a "Happy Memorial Day!" I offer a few alternatives for your discernment.

- "Enjoy your weekend, and I want you to know that I will be remembering what Memorial Day is truly about."
 - "Enjoy your weekend and I will be thinking about those who are no longer with us."
- "I will be taking a moment on Memorial Day to honor those who gave their lives in defense of our country."

Understandably, these words may seem a bit off-putting, nonetheless they are the words that Veterans would presumably rather hear on Memorial Day instead of "Happy Memorial Day!" At least this Veteran prefers these suggestions.

The roots of Memorial Day can be traced quite far back in history, with some even suggesting back to the ancient Greek civilization. But in the United States Decoration Day, as it was originally labeled, began with a proclamation on May 5, 1868, from General John A. Logan, a leader the Norther Civil War Veterans. General Logan proclaimed "The 30th of May 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land." It has since been renamed Memorial Day and includes the Veterans who lost their lives in World War I, World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, and the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. However, on Memorial Day many people honor all those who have died in defense of this country.



At sunrise on Memorial Day, the American flag should be raised briskly to full staff, then lowered slowly to half-staff until noon. At noon, the flag should be briskly raised to full staff and remain there until sunset. If you are not able to lower your flag to half-staff, flag etiquette dictates that a black ribbon be displayed on the flag in remembrance of the fallen. Also on Memorial Day, some may be familiar with red poppies being associated with or being distributed and worn during Memorial Day weekend. This tradition began with a wonderful poem written by John McCrae. I include it here for your remembrance of those who made the ultimate sacrifice. Please note, this poem is part of public domain.

In Flanders Fields
By John McCrae
In Flanders fields the poppies blow
Between the crosses, row on row,
That mark our place; and in the sky
The larks, still bravely singing, fly
Scarce heard amid the guns below.

We are the Dead. Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,
Loved and were loved, and now we lie,
In Flanders fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe:
To you from failing hands we throw
The torch; be yours to hold it high.
If ye break faith with us who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders fields.

What is Systemic Racism?



First in a series of nine USCCB backgrounders on racism and systemic racism, wealth, education, employment, housing, migration, criminal justice, the Native American experience, and voting. Combatting Racism - Parish Resources | USCCB

Today, racism continues to exist in our communities and in our parishes. Racism is what makes us see the "other" with suspicion or to attribute negative characteristics to an entire group of people. This evil manifests itself in our individual thoughts, and also in the workings of our society itself. Today's continuing inequalities in education, housing, employment, wealth, and representation in leadership positions are rooted in our country's shameful history of slavery and systemic racism.

The United States has made progress in eliminating some of the institutional, legalized racial discrimination of years past such as slavery, Jim Crow laws, "separate but equal" schools, and prohibitions on voting or owning land. These victories deserve to be remembered and celebrated. Still, these advances are incomplete.

- Unemployment rates for Africans Americans, Latinos, and Native Americans are considerably higher than the national average. Growing income inequality increasingly affects minorities.
- In the United States, median wealth for white households is ten times greater than for black households, and eight times greater than for Hispanic households.
- Minority homeownership rates lag behind their white counterparts, and yet research shows that minorities face extra hurdles in getting approved for mortgages.
- African Americans, Latinos, and Native Americans are disproportionately affected through every stage of the criminal justice system, despite the evidence that different racial and ethnic groups commit crimes at roughly the same rates.


