Just let the priest know and he will walk you through it!

ADVENT 2020 REFLECTION

REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL OF MARK

As we move into the new Liturgical Year, we launch into the Gospel of Mark. It is believed to be the first of the synoptic gospels, and it is also the shortest. Mark moved right to the point of identifying Jesus as Messiah. It seems that he was anxious to tell the story of Jesus as Miracle Worker and Healer, and so the story starts with Jesus' public life. Perhaps we could envision Mark as a reporter – anxious to put his scoop out to those within his reach.

This gospel was written in a time of persecution of Christians in Rome. There is an emphasis on the servanthood of Jesus' life, encouraging the local Christians to follow Jesus in his suffering and perhaps, even death. He recounts instances of Jesus' real human responses to life.

Mark pays particular attention and detail to Jesus' last hours, suffering and crucifixion. Unlike the other gospels, Mark's writing ends with Jesus' Resurrection and subsequent Great Commission. His urgent sharing of the story of Jesus encourages us to discipleship.

The Word of God is not merely read during the liturgy, it is proclaimed.

Proclamation rouses faith in those who hear the Word proclaimed.

As you listen to the Advent readings, meditate on the Word of God, reflecting on the significance of each of the Advent letters.

A – arrival

Preparing for the Arrival of the Messiah, arrival as the Lord of lords and King of kings

D – devotion

Live as obedient and faithful servants of God, engaged daily in his service

V − volition (the act of willing or resolving)

God is merciful and gives us grace, be willing to receive that grace and commit to his will and purpose

E – expectancy

Throughout Advent we grow in expectancy for the arrival of the Son of God, joyfully fulfilled on Christmas: "To you is born this day in the city of David, a Savior who is Christ the Lord"

N – narrative

The Scripture passages, the Bible narrative, read, heard and pondered during Advent

T - thanksgiving

The meaning of the word "Eucharist" is "Thanksgiving" and thanksgiving is offered to the Father through the Son and with the Holy Spirit.

Advent ... Prepare and Be Ready

Advent is the beginning of a new liturgical year and a time to prepare for the birth of Christ. We make ready Christmas decorations, sing carols, and display a Nativity creche. We focus our attention on the little town of Bethlehem and its most famous occupant. In the collect (opening prayer) for Mass on the first Sunday of Advent, we ask God the Father for "the resolve to run forth to meet your Christ with righteous deeds at his coming." This is a wonderful time to run to the Lord, to renew your desire, your nostalgia, your real longing for Christ to come. But it may come as a surprise to you, as much as Advent looks toward the manger in Bethlehem, it is an appropriate time to prepare for the second coming of Christ more so than His first! Advent teaches us to have the same attitude looking forward to the second coming as we have looking back at the first. The readings and prayers of Advent encourage us to celebrate the Incarnation, but also prepare for the day when Christ the Lord comes again in glory. Advent is a time for considering our lives, the circumstances, and situations we find ourselves in, and making a decision to live with faith in Christ Jesus. We look to that vulnerable Child laying in a manger and with great love we bring Him gifts. We provide a gift greater than the gold, frankincense and myrrh offered by the Maji. Place your vulnerabilities and fears beside Him. More than the worldly goods brought by the Wise Men, Jesus wants to take from us our brokenness, our hurts, and our sins. He wants to take these from us so that we too can live with the innocence of the newborn Child.

This Advent, let us look back on the first coming of Christ while preparing for His second coming. The greatest gift you can give this season is your brokenness, your hurts, and your sins. You can give them to Christ. The greatest gift you will receive in turn is the peace that comes from that intimate exchange with our Lord and God. However far we have ventured from the innocence of a babe in the cradle, the Lord is continually calling us back to His side at Bethlehem.

The Gospel for the first Sunday of Advent cautions us to "Be watchful! Be alert! We do not know when the time will come. We do not know when the Lord of the house is coming." We do know that Christ has come. And we know that He will come again. This Advent let us run to the Lord and renew within us a real longing for Christ who we know is to come.
