

Update from PADS Public Action to Deliver Shelter

Thank you to everyone who made the last two years of PADS outreach possible while our church was unable to open as a shelter site. The many meals, delicious desserts, amazing handmade hats, scarves and mittens, generous lunches prepared by Saint James School families, and of course the monetary donations have brought comfort and peace of mind to those in our community who face housing insecurity and hunger.

Thank you to those who delivered food to local hotels, whether it was restaurant meals in the early days of the pandemic, or meals prepared by the St. James community since June, 2020.

Thanks to all who came each week to pick up compostable food containers and fill them with nourishing food. We distributed meals to both those staying in the hotels as well as to those who chose not to seek shelter opportunities but still needed a healthy meal. Together we were able to serve thousands of meals and still remain good stewards of the thoughtful and generous donations.

SCHOOL AND MINISTRY UPDATES



Come experience how St. James School implements a strong math curriculum that pushes the students to articulate mathematical reasoning in addition to solving problems. Our student's math journey starts in PreK with number recognition and counting and finishes in 8th grade with our highest-level students receiving Algebra II concepts. Starting in 4th grade students begin being placed in flexible ability groups that differentiates the content, so students are being challenged and supported at their current ability level. Each school year we have a large number of students who place into the highest tracks of high school math at both private and public schools.
