Dear Friends,

I hope that you all celebrated the Independence Day weekend with family and friends, and were able to take a break from the busyness of everyday life and relax.

Sadly, the celebrations were marred by the tragedy of the shootings in Highland Park. We remember in prayer those people who lost their lives, and we also pray for their families in their terrible loss.

The phenomenon of disturbed young men resorting to terrible violence is very real. None of us knows what drives people to such terrible acts.

I believe wholeheartedly that God has created each of us in His image and likeness, that He loves us with a Father's love, and he has adopted us through Baptism, and loves us to the point of offering His life for us.

Tragedies like the Highland Park shooting and the Uvalde, Texas massacre remind us of the fallen state of humanity and of our world. We feel the terrible pain which is a part of human life. St. John Paul II said, "Jesus Christ is the answer to which every human life is the question." We must not let these seemingly senseless tragedies distract our attention from Jesus. Truly, He is the answer. Let us keep our gaze on Him.

The French writer Paul Claudell wrote, "Jesus did not come to explain away suffering, or to remove it. He came to fill it with His presence." The Cross is the image of Jesus suffering with us.
