Dear Friends,

Last Tuesday we held a staff planning day to look at the year ahead and talk about the mission we are engaged in as the Church. It was an invigorating day of sharing our vision and our hopes for the parish.

Several years ago, I was on a committee interviewing potential candidates for the diaconate. One of the questions asked was "what is the purpose of the Church?" Their responses varied widely; some right on target and some pretty far from it. Is there a definitive answer to this question?

Yes, there is. The mission of the Church, as we understand it, comes from the Great Commission in Matthew 28:18-20:

Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age." The final words of Canon 1752 of the Code of Canon Law of the Roman Catholic Church are: "The salvation of souls, which must always be the supreme law in the Church, is to be kept before one's eyes."

Everything we do as a parish flows from these passages. Discipleship and our life lived in relationship with Jesus leads to mission and service to our neighbor. Another way of saying this is worship of the true God compels us to acts of love and justice.

I am grateful to all of our dedicated staff members who participate so wholeheartedly in the mission of Jesus.

We come to you with heavy hearts. We ask for your healing as we continue the mission for peace and an end to violence throughout our country.


As our hearts break, help us to fill the open wounds with Your love and compassion. Help us to turn to you with our pain, confusion, anger and sadness as we support one another to move forward.

Amen.


