We are called to be zealous warriors for Christ. Our Christian life is a battle. The world hates our Christian faith and challenges it at every turn. But the Lord is faithful to us and is always with us in this spiritual battle.

We must keep reminding ourselves of our true identity: we are the beloved sons and daughters of the King. We have been claimed and adopted by God through Jesus Christ. He has given us an unsurpassed dignity greater than anything the world can give. On October 5, we will begin our process for those wishing to explore the Catholic faith and hopefully be received into the Church at Easter. This process is known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). Please contact me if you are interested or if you know someone who is interested. It is a great adventure!

A WARM WELCOME TO A FAMILY IN NEED

St. James recently welcomed a refugee family of five from Colombia to their new apartment on the north side of Chicago. Working with our Peace & Justice ministry and Exodus International, over 50 parishioners donated household supplies and food, and 8 people set up the apartment. From home baked cookies to comforting pillows, everything for a new start was provided. The family wishes us to know how grateful they are for our support. They told us that their lives were endangered by the violence in their country. The father and son are skilled construction workers. They felt our love and support, and we will keep them in our prayers.

Some reflections on the day:

"It was such an honor and privilege to welcome and provide some of the necessities of daily living."

"Making the love of God real and present to those in need."

"They arrived in a completely new environment not speaking English, with its own gargantuan share of challenges. They will have to rebuild their lives from the ground up. I am deeply proud of them and of their trust due to the support of the Ethiopian agency that sponsored them. I was grateful that Chicago has that agency plus Exodus who helped us help the family feel a warm, loving "Welcome to Chicago!" No one is leaving them to fend for themselves. We all will walk with and pray for them. "



The Loaves & Fishes Ministry provides an evening meal and a brown bag lunch for women at Sarah's Circle and men at North Side Housing. Our ministry operates every Saturday beginning in October and continues through the last weekend in April.

Numerous St. James groups prepare lunches and meals, and many families and individuals make lunches, pick up soup and bread and give up their Saturday evenings to deliver food to the shelters. Thanks to all who have helped in the past.
