Dear Friends,

We have heard some rich Scripture passages about prayer in the past few weeks, and today that theme continues, but with a different twist. Jesus' parable about the two men going to the Temple to pray addresses the proper disposition for prayer. That is a sense of humility.

The Modern Catholic Dictionary defines humility as "the moral virtue that keeps a person from reaching beyond himself. It restrains the unruly desire for personal greatness and leads people to an orderly love of themselves based on a true appreciation of their position with respect to God and their neighbors."

"Religious humility recognizes one's total dependence on God; moral humility recognizes one's creaturely equality with others. Yet humility is not only opposed to pride; it is also opposed to immoderate selfabjection, which would fail to recognize God's gifts and use them according to his will."

Humility keeps us grounded (the root of the word is humus, or ground). It reminds us that, as Bishop Robert Barron says, "my life is not all about me."

Goodbye, Sister Joanne



Help Those Experiencing Homelessness

Volunteer for St. James PADS (Public Action to Deliver Shelter)

St. James hosts a Wednesday to Thursday overnight shelter for our local unhoused commuity. Volunteers provide a hot dinner, warm place to stay, breakfast and a lunch to go the next morning. All guests are registered and vetted through the PADS organization.

Over the past two-and-a-half years, COVID-19 and the challenges associated with the pandemic have made it impossible to open our PADS site. St. James plans to reopen this fall if we have enough volunteers to staff the site. Please review the needs below and prayerfully consider volunteering so we can continue to help the unhoused. Many St. James parishioners attended "Taste of Viator House," on Saturday, October 15 at St. Viator High School.

The event was a fundraiser for Viator House of Hospitality. The organization provides compassionate accompaniment of young adult male immigrants seeking asylum.

Grounded in the Viatorian commitment to young people and to "those accounted of little importance," and established January 17, 2017, Viator House of Hospitality provides a supportive living environment where these young men can attend school, improve their language skills, grow spiritually and emotionally, receive proper medical care, and work while they await court proceedings that determine whether they can become U.S. citizens.

If approved to pursue citizenship, they can remain at VHH for a period of time as they begin to build a life here. JOIN US
