

Dear Friends,



Volunteer for St. James PADS (Public Action to Deliver Shelter)

St. James hosts a Wednesday to Thursday overnight shelter for our local unhoused commuity. Volunteers provide a hot dinner, warm place to stay, breakfast and a lunch to go the next morning. All guests are registered and vetted through the PADS organization.

Over the past two and a half years, COVID-19 and the challenges associated with the pandemic have made it impossible to open our PADS site. St. James plans to reopen this fall if we have enough volunteers to staff the site. Please review the needs below and prayerfully consider volunteering so we can continue to help the unhoused. Set-Up Shift

• Set up beds and bedding before the shelter opens its doors

1st Shift 7:00 pm - 9:00 pm or 11:00 pm

- Sign in guests and take lunch orders for the next day
- Help guests with laundry and showers

3rd Shift 3:00 am - 7:00 am

- Breakfast (no cooking involved)
- Wake up guests for 7 am departure

Food Team

Join a team in preparing and serving food for the homeless guests

2nd Shift 11:00 pm - 3:00 am

- Make lunches for the next day
- Supervise and be there for guests


Clean-Up Shift 6:30 am - 7:30 am

Messages of inclusion and acceptance were shared all around the world and at St. James. At our Masses, speakers highlighted Exodus World Service, a local Christian organization, one of several groups that is helping refugees.

Recently, about 50 St. James people helped to assemble a Welcome to America Pack for a family from Colombia that is being settled in the Chicago area. At least 33 parishioners took brochures and phoned Exodus World Services to get more information. Exodus has various ways to be involved, through their Pack Programs, New Neighbors Program, weekly prayer emails, and financial contributions.



In the words of Pope Francis: "If we want to cooperate with our heavenly Father in building the future, let us do so together with our brothers and sisters who are migrants and refugees. Let us build the future today! For the future begins today and it begins with each of us. We cannot leave to future generations the burden of responsibility for decisions that need to be made now, so that God's plan for the world may be realized and his Kingdom of justice, fraternity, and peace may come."
