"Jesus told his disciples a parable about the necessity for them to pray always without becoming weary."

Luke 18:1

Jesus tells the disciples this parable about the woman who comes to the judge repeatedly, asking that he render a verdict favorable to her. At last the judge relents and rules in favor of the woman, tired of her constantly bothering him.

Jesus makes the point that if even this dishonest judge answers the woman's plea, how much more the Father will answer the prayers of his people.

He is teaching us something about prayer. Be persistent. Be specific. Bring your needs to the Lord, and don't be surprised when he answers your prayer. Does a loving Father ignore the pleas of his children? Our God is indeed a loving Father who desires what is best for us, even if we aren't clear on what is best.

For over thirty years, the St. James community has reached out to the homeless in Chicago's Uptown neighborhood. The Loaves & Fishes Ministry provides an evening meal and a brown bag lunch for women at Sarah's Circle and men at North Side Housing. Our ministry operates every Saturday beginning in October and continues through the last weekend in April.

Numerous St. James groups prepare lunches and meals, and many families and individuals make lunches, pick up soup and bread and give up their Saturday evenings to deliver food to the shelters. Thanks to all who have helped in the past.



Public Action to Deliver Shelter

Saint James hosts a Wednesday to Thursday overnight shelter for our local homeless community. Members of the Saint James community provide a hot dinner, warm place to stay, breakfast and a lunch to-go the next morning. All guests are registered and vetted through the PADS organization.

We need your help!

Please consider donating your time alongside others who are called to serve.

PADS Shifts

The PADS site is open October- April. Training will be provided. The PADS program asks that all volunteers be vaccinated.

Set-Up Shift

- Food Team
- Set up beds and bedding before the shelter opens its doors

1st Shift 7:00 pm - 9:00 pm or 11:00 pm

- Sign-in PADS guests and take lunch orders for the next day
- Help PADS guests with laundry and showers

3rd Shift 3:00 am - 7:00 am

- Breakfast (no cooking involved)
- Wake up guests for 7 am departure

2nd Shift 11:00 pm - 3:00 am

For the homeless guests

- Make lunches for the next day
- Supervise and be there for PADS guests

Join a team in preparing and serving food

Clean-Up Shift 6:30 am - 7:30 am

- Clean areas used by guests
- Put sleeping pads and bedding away service hour opportunity for older children with a parent-
