# Today's Readings

### **First Reading**

The King of the world will raise us up to live again forever. (2 Maccabees 7:1-2, 9-14)

### Psalm

Lord, when your glory appears, my joy will be full. (Psalm 17)

### Gospel

Those who are deemed worthy of the coming age can no longer die. (Luke 20:27-38 [27, 34-38])



# "We are asked to give everything to God, holding nothing back."

"The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise." Luke 20

These words can sound strange to us. Is Jesus denigrating marriage? I don't believe he is. Perhaps he is, rather, putting marriage in its proper perspective. Obviously Jesus values marriage. He upholds the traditional Jewish teaching on marriage in Matthew 19:5-6: "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh."

Maybe Jesus is telling us that as beautiful as marriage can be, it is only a foretaste of what is in store for his faithful disciples in eternity. This eternal life is worth dying for. In the first reading today from 2 Maccabees, the seven brothers submitted to torture and death rather than worship a false God. They knew that salvation was worth the cost. Salvation has a cost. Ultimately it is the life of Jesus – God Himself – which won our salvation. What is the cost for us? Everything! We are asked to give everything to God, holding nothing back. This will probably mean for most of us that we must let go of our idols, our fierce independence, our pride, and turn it all over to God. It means that we must repent and change, especially before we approach the Lord in Holy Communion. He desires communion with us. Are we able to accept that desire, and change our lives for it?

We kindly ask that you keep our men and women of the armed forces in your prayers always.


Veterans will be recognized at 7:30 am Mass on Friday, November 11 here at St. James. We will remember family members who were killed in action as well as current military.

#### THIS WEEK'S STEWARDSHIP RECOMMENDATION: Tips to Save Energy and Money this Winter

1) Use a programmable thermostat: program to lower the heat by 8 degrees Fahrenheit when you are away from home. Reduce a few degrees when asleep. You can save up to \$180 per year.

 Seal and weatherstrip: can improve the heating system efficiency by as much as 20%.
Keep your furnace air filters clean: At minimum,

change the filter every three months. This lowers energy bills and improves air quality.

4) Tune up your HVAC equipment yearly.
5) Close your fireplace damper when not in use.

Turn water heater down to 120°F

# St. James PADS Update

## **Our Shelter Remains Closed**

The overnight shelter at St. James will not be opening in November. Currently families and those with any medical fragility remain sheltering in hotels and only a small percentage of those who have been asked to leave the hotels are seeking shelter in churches. There is another church open on Wednesday nights and the number of quests showing up there is minimal.

We would love to believe this means that the need has diminished but that seems extremely unlikely and we remain uncertain as to how and where the clients are meeting their needs.

COVID has changed the face of many things, and homelessness is no exception. St. James will monitor the situation closely and will open when the numbers allow us to do so. In the meantime we will explore other ways of serving the unhoused and meeting those in need where they are.

The St. James PADS program has been an integral part of our community outreach, and its success is due to the commitment and dedication of our volunteers. We look forward to serving the community as soon as the current situation changes.

We will continue to do outreach of food, clothing and individual requests as needed. Keep watching the bulletin for future volunteer opportunities to serve.
