Dear Friends,

The Scripture readings at mass are becoming more explicitly focused on the imminent coming of Jesus at Christmas. Today we hear the reading from Matthew's Gospel about Joseph's role in the Holy Family.

Not understanding what had happened with Mary becoming pregnant with the Messiah, Joseph planned to quietly divorce her. But the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her."

Joseph did as he was asked. He accepted the vocation to which the Lord was calling him. He is a model of Christian discipleship, obviously and necessarily a man of prayer, who was open to receiving what the Lord was saying.

## "Listening to and hearing the Lord requires silence."

The path of Christian discipleship requires prayer, and prayer involves listening. Listening cannot be done very easily in the cacophony of noise and distraction surrounding us. Listening and hearing the Lord requires silence.

Consider that the Lord is asking you to take some time apart, in silence, to be open to His voice, especially in the chaotic days leading up to Christmas. Maybe some time in silent prayer in our Adoration Chapel is just the place for that.


