This question came up once at a meeting of the Presbyteral Council, an elected and appointed group of priests who meet monthly with the Archbishop: "What is the purpose of the Mass?"

The answer was "to glorify God and sanctify people." The Society of Jesus has a famous motto, *Ad Majorem Dei Gloria* - To the Greater Glory of God. It is often abbreviated as AMDG, and you will see this inscribed on stationery, in stained glass, and carved into the facades of buildings.

Although the desire for recognition and praise for the good that we do is normal and even a human need, it is not goal of all we do, or rather, all that the Lord does through us, In all we do, may we give glory to our God, and grow in holiness at the same time.

When we gather to celebrate the Mass, I pray that everything we bring to the Mass and contribute to it is about the worship and praise of God. I pray that through this action of the Trinity - Jesus offering Himself as a sacrificial offering to the Father in the power and working of the Holy Spirit - and joining us to Jesus – will bear fruit in our lives as we grow in holiness.

Let us be the light of the world and the salt of the earth, glorifying the Father in all we do.






# RENEW MY CHURCH SUMMARY

Dear St. James Parishioners.

During the last two months of 2022, our parish participated in the Renew My Church (RMC) process. We were grouped with St. Mary in Buffalo Grove, St. Joseph the Worker in Wheeling, St. Edna, and Our Lady of the Wayside, both in Arlington Heights. To culminate the meeting phase of the process Fr. Ed and part of our Evangelization Team met with the Chief Operating

Officer of the Archdiocese, as well as Bishop Casey.

There will be no changes because of the RMC process for our grouping. No schools will be closing, and no parishes will be combining with other parishes. Our RMC process was more dedicated to sharing best practices within the group and identifying strengths and opportunities in our respective parishes. The strengths and opportunities were broken down to Operational and Ministerial.

#### St. James' Operational Strengths

- · Quality staff dedicated to missionary discipleship
- · Strong financial base
- Quality physical structures

#### St. James' Operational Opportunities

- Managing high volume of incoming community contacts
- Maximizing the use of our physical structures
- Refining utilization of staff talent
- Increasing enrollment in our school

#### St. James' Ministerial Strengths

- · Quality ministry leads
- · Quantity of priests in residence
- Amount of opportunities for Adoration & Confession

#### St. James' Ministerial Opportunities

- Engaging all families after sacramental celebrations
- Inviting the parish community to return to Mass & prayer
- Teaching the Kerygma through parish and school events
- Evangelizing during the preparation period leading up to baptisms and marriages

The RMC Team also inspected our physical structures. I am pleased to say that our facilities all were found to be in "above average" condition. Nevertheless, the Archdiocesan RMC team made maintenance recommendations to be addressed anywhere from immediately to seven years out. Because we have taken such good care of our facilities, the recommended maintenance for our physical structures over the next several years will cost approximately \$2,000,000. We had already identified many of the projects before the RMC process began. In fact, some of the work was already accomplished this past fall.

The Archdiocesan RMC Team showed interest in the efforts that we are putting forth here at St. James. Looking at the numbers (in Mass attendance, celebrations of baptisms, funerals, marriages, annual collections, and school enrollment) we are faring better than the U.S. Catholic Church. We stand out in the Archdiocese of Chicago. This is happening because of the efforts continually put forth by the parish community at-large. Let's continue to focus our lives around developing a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ, Our Lord and Savior.

#### **US CATHOLIC CHURCH STATS**


- Catholic marriages are down 55% since 1990
- Baptisms went from 986,000 to 694,000 (-30%)
- 1 in 5 children baptized do not receive 1st communion
- 2 in 5 children baptized are not confirmed
- 85% of children confirmed stop practicing their faith by age 21

#### **ARCHDIOCESE OF CHICAGO STATS**


- 35% decline in Mass attendance 1999 to 2019: 195,000+ fewer people attend Mass each Sunday compared to 20 years ago. Covid led to an additional 37% decline between Oct. 2019 and May 2022.
- Significant population shifts: Areas of Chicago that were once predominantly Catholic with a parish for each ethnic group now have fewer people and fewer Catholics but often the same number of facilities as in the past.
- Fewer priests to serve our communities: More than 160 priests will reach retirement age in the next decade with fewer priests being ordained per year (4 of the next 5 years will have 3 or fewer ordinations, the other year will have a maximum of 7 ordinations) to replace them
- An aging infrastructure: Many parishes are significantly under-investing in building repairs, leading to facility challenges that take time and resources away from ministry.
- Insufficient resources to invest in ministry: Prior to RMC parish consolidations, over 40% of parishes in the archdiocese did not have a full-time staff member dedicated to ministry except for the priest.







- Mass attendance from 1999 to 2019 declined approximately 32%, lower than the overall archdiocesan decline.
- $\bullet$  Mass attendance from 2019 to 2022 (i.e, pre Covid to through Covid) declined  $\sim$ 8%, a much smaller decline than the average across the archdiocese.



- Baptisms remain very high relative to the average of 46 per parish across the archdiocese (in 2019).
- Marriages are also higher than the archdioces average of 8 per parish (in 2019).
- The parish historically has had  $\sim$  3x the number of funerals than the archdiocesan average of 29 per parish with a healthy ratio of baptisms to funerals.
