

Go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift.

"Therefore, if you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift there at the altar, go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift." Matthew 5:23-24

I remember going to the wake of an elderly neighbor and meeting her brother. He was distraught as he said, "I hadn't spoken to my sister in over thirty years, and now she's gone. I don't even remember what we fought about."

Be reconciled with those with whom we have a difference. Then come to the altar with your gift. Jesus follows this with some very difficult teachings regarding adultery, divorce, lust, swearing oaths, and revenge. Sin is very real "Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the evil one." Matthew 5:37

Jesus is asking us to live with undivided and pure hearts. It can be tremendously challenging at times, and none of us does it perfectly. But it is the way into the Heart of Jesus and into His Kingdom. He gives us the grace we need to respond to His call. The grace of the sacraments enables us to live righteously — in right relationship with God. Please come and receive this grace.




