Dear Friends,

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the holy season of Lent. Please come to Mass at one of the five times it is offered, or come for ashes in the school chapel from 4-7 pm. We are marked with ashes as a reminder of our mortality and as a proclamation of our Christian faith.

Pease see details on page three for Lenten offerings, and mark your calendars for "SEEK" on March 10-12, which will include a concert by the renowned Catholic singer Matt Maher. Details are in today's bulletin, and on our website.

During Lent, we are asked to do three things: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Why not attend weekday Mass or come to the Stations of the Cross or Adoration or read the daily Mass readings every day? Maybe taking time to pray as a family or as a married couple would be a possibility.

Fasting is an ancient practice whose goal is to detach ourselves from the

world and thus open ourselves more fully to the grace of God. Fasting is only required on two days, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, but we can benefit from fasting on a more regular basis too.


Almsgiving is giving to the poor. Many in our parish do this regularly. We can make a special effort to do it during Lent, and thereby serve the Lord in the poor.

I invite every member of the parish to receive the sacrament of Penance/Reconciliation during Lent. During the week of March 27, multi-parish Lenten penance services will be held. Confessions will also be available at the regular time on Saturdays as well as on Tuesdays from 6-7 pm (except for March 28). This sacrament of forgiveness is a great preparation for Easter, and can be a powerful source of inner healing.

Our sincere practice of Lenten penance can lead to a more joyful celebration of the Resurrection of the Lord at Easter.







Dear Fellow Parishioners,

On February 22 we begin the Lenten season which gives us an opportunity to reach out to those in need in a special way. We are so happy that St. James Parish has selected Foundation for Children in Need as the Lenten cause for this year. We want to thank Father Ed, both Father Pauls, the pastoral council, parish staff and the entire parish community for giving us this honor and privilege. We will journey with you during Lent and share more about our work in each Lenten bulletin. Let us walk together, giving alms, fasting and praying to help all those poor people who struggle on a daily basis, just to live another day. We are confident that sharing our stories of hope and outreach will enrich you during this Holy Lenten Season.

F.C.N. had humble beginnings when we started our office in Arlington Heights in 2002. Al and Gail Walton, who are both deceased now, were connected to India through their adopted son Benjamin, who was born in Kolkata, India. The Waltons hosted the F.C.N. office in their home for six straight years. Father Bill Zavaski, our Pastor Emeritus, graciously welcomed us into the Parish community. We were provided housing for two years through several parish families and then for three years in parishowned housing. With the loving support of Father Bill and many parishioners, we made St. James Parish our home base away from our home in India.

The mission and vision of F.C.N. is to provide opportunities for Catholic Communities in the U.S. to reach out and bring hope to the poor and needy in the villages of India. Each summer we travel to parishes around the country making appeals in order to (1) promote the needs of people in the villages of India, (2) request prayers (3) raise financial support for education, health care and self-sustaining economic solutions.

God has richly blessed us and F.C.N. since 2002. Today, F.C.N. is able to sponsor more than 1,700 children and college students and 100 elderly. We have built several schools, student residences, two homes for the aged and a community health center. All this good work has been possible through your continued prayers and generosity. We welcome you to join us especially during this Holy Lenten Season to consider making little sacrifices of almsgiving, fasting and prayer so that a child or senior in need in the villages of India might experience your gift of love and have their hope renewed. May we look to change ourselves during the next forty days by changing the lives of those less fortunate. We wish you a Grace-filled Lenten Season.
