



Today's Readings

First Reading:

I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard; my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting. (Is 50:6)

Psalm:

My God, my God, why have you abandoned me? (Ps 22)

Second Reading:

He humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him. (Phil 2:8-9)

Gospel:

The centurion and the men with him who were keeping watch over Jesus feared greatly when they saw the earthquake and all that was happening, and they said, "Truly, this was the Son of God!" (Mt 26:54)



" Jesus emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."

~ Philippians 2:7-8

These are words of the Philippians hymn, the second reading of today's Mass, from the letter of St. Paul to the Christians of Philippi in Greece. It is a fitting beginning of this Holy Week, as we walk with Jesus and His disciples and His mother through the awful and beautiful events of that week.

This week we remember so many things which are at the heart of our faith: the Eucharist and Christ's priesthood, His sacrificial death on Calvary, and then, finally, His glorious resurrection on that first Easter Sunday.

The Philippians hymn ends with the proclamation of this glory:


"Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

The Foundation for Children in Need Home

The F.C.N. Home for the Destitute is the dream project of Foundation for Children in Need. It's an hour drive from the city of Hyderabad. This home was built four years ago with generous donations from many in the United States.

Presently there are forty elderly and physically challenged people who reside in the home free of charge. There are four nuns who are the administrators.

Other activities that take place at F.C.N. Home include:

- Opportunities for sponsors and volunteers from the U.S.A to visit F.C.N. Home and see the work of F.C.N. firsthand.
- Coordinating cleft lip and cleft palate surgeries.
- Tailoring training for girls from villages who come for a six-month training program. Right now, there are eleven girls in this program.
- Training and meetings for F.C.N. Sponsorship Project Coordinators.
- Sponsorship letter writing and opportunities to serve the needy for F.C.N. sponsored college students.
- Distribution of notebooks, dictionaries, school bags, inspirational books, clothing, and blankets to school children.
- Distribution of clothing and blankets to elderly in the villages.
- Distribution of sewing machines to needy women which gives them economic independence.
- Relief work in response to natural disasters.




