Today's Readings

First Reading:

I will put my spirit in you that you may live, and I will settle you upon your land; thus you shall know that I am the LORD. (Ez 37:14)

Psalm:

With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption. (Ps 130)

Second Reading:

If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit dwelling in you. (Rom 8:11)

Gospel:

"I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (Jn 11:25-26)



"Martha said to him, 'Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, he who is coming into the world."

~ JOHN 11:27

Martha makes this profession of faith to Jesus as she is mourning the death of her brother Lazarus who, along with his sisters Martha and Mary, was a dear friend of the Lord. Martha has gone out to greet Jesus when he comes into the village of Bethany, where they live. This profession of faith comes after an exchange with Jesus which captures the essence of our faith. Jesus identifies Himself as the Resurrection and the Life, and proclaims that the one who believes in Him, even if he dies, will live. He asks Martha, "Do you believe this?"

The same question is asked to each of us. Do we really believe that Jesus is the Resurrection and the Life? Lent is the opportunity to ponder this question more deeply. Our entire lives are different if we make this profession of faith and make Jesus the center of all that we do

We are almost at Palm Sunday and Holy Week, when the reality of Jesus' suffering, death and Resurrection are made present to us in the powerful liturgies of that week and of the Easter Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. This week, we are offered many opportunities to prepare for these holy days in the sacrament of Reconciliation/ Penance. The area parishes are again cooperating over the week at various locations. The times and locations are listed in the bulletin.
