Showdown at Sundown

Join us for the 5:00 pm Pentecost Vigil Mass on Saturday, May 27

f gunslingers choose high noon to confront one another and others choose to meet at the crack of dawn, why do we Catholics choose sundown? When there is something very important to celebrate, such as Easter, we start the evening before at sundown; we call it a vigil.

The root of our practice comes from Judaism; after all, Jesus is Jewish, and the foundation of the Church is fundamentally Jewish. The Jewish sabbath, in obedience to the Third Commandment, is held on Saturday, yet the actual start of it is Friday at sunset. The Jewish day is counted from sundown on Friday to sundown on Saturday. For us as Catholic Christians, the Holy Day is now held on Sunday, the day Jesus rose from the dead, yet we too keep that sense of "sundown" in terms of vigils.

The word itself comes from the Latin vigilia, which means wakefulness or to keep watch. A vigilia was also the fourth part of the night watch; a reference to the practice of Roman soldiers. We see references to the Church holding prayer vigil in the writings of St. Jerome (fourth century) as well in the writings of Tertullian (second to third

centuries). Of particular interest to us are the writings of Egeria, whose journal recordings of her pilgrimage to the Holy Land in the fourth century describe the celebration of the Easter Vigil in Jerusalem.

It is the celebration of the early Catholic Christian vigils that inform our practice today: a liturgical service that was not a Mass, but consisting in prayers, readings from the scriptures, the singing of Psalms, and homilies/preaching. This would continue through the night until Mass at dawn since Christ rose from the dead at dawn. (So yes, we also observe the timing of "the crack of dawn.") The original practice for Easter Vigil followed this pattern, with the readings from scripture outlining salvation history and the lead-in to the Eucharistic celebration being baptism and chrismation at dawn.

We here at St. James have already celebrated the Easter Vigil this year, it is now time to celebrate the vigil of Pentecost, continuing the practice of the Church across the millennia.


