SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER (DIVINE MERCY)



Today's Readings

First Reading:

Every day they devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple area and to breaking bread in their homes. (Acts 2:46)

Psalm:

Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, his love is everlasting. (Ps 118)

Second Reading:

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in his great mercy gave us a new birth to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. (1 Pt 1:3)

Gospel:

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." (Jn 20:19)

Dear Friends,

Easter Greetings on this Divine Mercy Sunday! Christ is Risen! Indeed He is Risen!

Just after His death on the Cross, rather than break Jesus' legs, as was the Roman custom, John recounts that because Jesus was already dead, they pierced His side, and, as in the image of Divine Mercy revealed to St. Faustina, blood and water flowed out.

The red and blue rays of light in the image represent the sacraments of Baptism and Holy Eucharist. St. Augustine thought this act of self-giving love was an image of Jesus' marital, or nuptial relationship with His Bride, the Church.

Other Church Fathers understood it as an image of the birth of the Bride from the side of Christ. The image of water flowing from the Temple in Ezekiel 47 and in Revelation 22 come to mind.

We can pose two questions to ourselves. How are we spiritually reborn? And how do we consummate our spousal union with Christ? The answers are clear: through Baptism we are reborn, and through the Eucharist our relationship is consummated. By His death on the Cross, Jesus gave himself in an act of perfect love. The Kingdom of God is ushered in during the darkness of Good Friday. Our Passover is complete as Jesus drinks the fourth cup of wine as he dies.

Today please come to Our Lady of the Wayside for our joint celebration of Divine Mercy. The event begins at 1:30, with confessions starting at 2:00. Divine Mercy prayers will begin at 3:00 pm.

Thanks to all who did so much to make our Easter and Holy Week services and masses so meaningful. Priests and deacons, servers, decorators, sacristans, liturgical ministers and ushers, musicians and singers, maintenance men and office staff: you are very generous, and I am very grateful.

APRIL IS CHILD ABUSE AWARENESS MONTH

Children are the world's most valuable resource and its best hope for the future. - John F. Kennedy

In the United States, about one in seven children under age 18 has experienced child abuse & neglect by a parent, caregiver, or another person in a custodial role. Because so many cases go unreported, this is likely an underestimate. Physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse and neglect result in long-term effects that can be devastating. Immediate physical injuries often lead to emotional and psychological problems such as anxiety and post-traumatic stress. These children are also at increased risk for delayed brain development, future violence victimization, and substance abuse.

Everyone benefits when children have safe, stable, nurturing relationships and environments.

Stepping Stones

- KNOW THE SIGNS and RISK FACTORS See: Mayo Clinic Child Abuse; American Psychological Assoc. Understanding & Preventing Child Abuse, CDC – Fast Facts: Preventing Child Abuse & Neglect
- KNOW YOURSELF Recognize when you're about to lose it. Take a break. Reach out. Seek help in learning to cope with stress & relate positively with your child. If you were abused, get counseling so you don't repeat or teach abusive behaviors. Build a network of support.
- SUPPORT Be a good neighbor & help out a stressed parent; volunteer for or donate to programs or agencies that support families or work to end poverty, a known risk factor for abuse and neglect.
- INTERVENE If you feel that a child may be in immediate danger, call 9-1-1. If you suspect abuse or neglect, call or text the Childhelp National Child Abuse Hotline: 800-4-A-CHILD (800-422-4453).
