

Dear Friends,

Congratulations to Father Dan Korenchan, ordained a priest of Jesus Christ yesterday at Holy Name Cathedral by the laying on of hands and the invocation of the Holy Spirit by our archbishop, Cardinal Cupich. 

### A Fifty Day Party

Join us for the 5:00 pm Pentecost vigil Mass on Saturday, May 27

ur celebration of Pentecost will close out the Easter season, coming fifty days after Easter. For us, Easter is not just a day, but an octave (celebrated across eight days) and an entire period of celebration. We are going out the way we came in: with a vigil.

If you participated in the Easter vigil, then you will see something similar at the Pentecost vigil, but there are two options. The first option combines first vespers or evening prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours with Mass. The Liturgy of the Hours is something that priest, religious, and consecrated women pray every day: praying the Psalms at various times during the day from morning until night.

The second option is the one we are going to employ here at St. James. The Mass will begin in the usual way, and then after the penitential rite, we will delay the singing of the Gloria. What will follow is similar to the pattern of readings from the Easter vigil. There will be four readings from the Old Testament speaking of God's saving actions. After each reading is a psalm response or a period of silence. Then the priest will pray a prayer corresponding to the reading.

The readings for this extended vigil are: the Tower of Babel (Gn 11:1-9), God's Descent on Mt. Sinai where the

Law/Torah was given (Ex 19:3-8a), the prophet Ezekiel's vision of the dry bones coming to life (Ez 37:1-14) and then Joel's prophecy of God pouring out his Spirit on all flesh (JI 3:1-5).

After these readings, just as in the Easter vigil, we will sing the gloria, followed by the collect, or "opening prayer." Next we read from the epistle, specifically St. Paul's letter to the Romans in regard to the Spirit's working in us. Finally we will sing the Alleluia and read the Gospel as Mass then continues as normal.

For us, the Pentecost vigil is not just a recollection of what God has done in the past. By celebrating what God has done for us, especially in Christ Jesus, God's works become present to us here and now.

As the Holy Spirit descended on the Church at her beginning, the Spirit renews his work within us now at St. James. This is especially true as we gather for the Eucharist, which makes Christ's saving Passion, death, and Resurrection present to us under the appearance of bread and wine. We invite you to come on Saturday, May 27 at 5:00 pm.



### Remember: He Prays for Us

Traditionally, the four writers of the Gospels are symbolized by four creatures that make their way into Church art and architecture: Matthew, an angel; Mark, a lion; Luke, an ox; and John, an eagle. These images can be found in churches across the world, a nod to those who recorded the stories of Jesus for us, thousands of years ago.

Today's Gospel was written by John. There are a few reasons why John is symbolized by an eagle, but my favorite explanation is that his writings soar like an eagle into the sky with their beautiful, poetic language. The prayer we hear today is no different — Jesus invokes God in a long discourse that might seem mystifying at times, the same way that a poem can be perplexing to understand when we are unfamiliar with the pacing or format.

Consider holding onto the shortest sentence in this prayer: "I pray for them."

Jesus prays for us. For me. For you.

Let that sink deep into your being.

Jesus is on your side. He is aware of what you are holding at this moment. He is aware of your pain, your faith, your mission. And He's rooting for you. This prayer was recorded thousands of years ago, far before you were born. Since before you were born, you were held in prayer. With that certainty, we live.


