



Dear Friends,

This time of the liturgical year is filled with beautiful and powerful solemn feasts. Last week we celebrated the Ascension in an extraordinary way, as Fr. Dan Korenchan offered his First Mass. Thanks to all who pitched in to prepare such an inspiring Mass and the reception afterwards.

Today, of course, is the solemn feast of Pentecost, the birth of the Church. We can pray together, "Come, Holy Spirit. Fill the hearts of your faithful; enkindle in them the fire of your love."

Next week is Trinity Sunday, commemorating the central mystery of our Catholic faith - that we worship one God in three Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This reafirms that we are drawn into the dynamic relationship of love which is the interior life of God.

Corpus Christi is June 11, when we glory in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the form of bread and wine. In the Mass we join ourselves to Christ's offering of Himself out of love to the

Father, in the power of the Holy Spirit. In Holy Communion, we are fed with the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus, the greatest gift He has given us.

We are reinstating the offering of Holy Communion under both species on Corpus Christi Sunday. If you are prepared to receive the Body and Blood of Christ that day, you are invited to receive from the chalice as well as the Host. Of course, it is never required, so if you are uncomfortable receiving from the chalice, receiving the Host alone is fine. Keep in mind that Jesus is wholly present, Body and Blood, under either species - in the form of bread or in the form of wine.

Holy Communion Under Both Species

Returns June 10-11 at St. James

The public health emergency attributable to the COVID-19 pandemic expired on May 11. Consequently, the Archdiocese of Chicago is lifting all COVID-related restrictions in our churches, including the restriction on communal reception of the Precious Blood from the chalice.

In a recent statement to clergy and staff, the Archdiocese notes, "Though the health emergency is over, we must continue to respect each other's preferences regarding personal health and safety. ... Some ministers or parishioners may be uncomfortable receiving the Precious Blood from the Chalice. In all situations we must act prudently and charitably

toward each individual and the entire assembly."

At St. James, we are reinstating the offering of Holy Communion under both species on Corpus Christi Sunday, June 10-11. Please see Father Ed's comments on page 2 of this bulletin for the spiritual details.

Powerful Words and Heavenly Speech


I hope you'll acknowledge with me a simple fact: it's not normal to have tongues of fire "part and come to rest" on people. It is actually pretty strange. Yet that is precisely what we celebrate in this feast of Pentecost. How can this mean something to us in our daily lives?

Jews had a tradition that heaven is a temple made of bricks of fire. So, through the apostles, the heavenly temple is coming to earth. But this fire looks like tongues, not bricks. That means that heavenly speech will be crucial to building a dwelling place for God on earth among men and women. So, it's no surprise when the apostles begin to speak in a miraculous way that is understood by all language groups. They are speaking of what God has done in and through Jesus: bringing heaven to earth and uniting all peoples to God and to each other.

How often our speech divides: gossip, slander, insults, and so on. How strange and rare it is when people speak in ways that truly unite instead of divide. Imagine how powerful it would be if you and I began to speak at home, at work, and in our community in a way that made people hear heavenly speech. Imagine if you spoke of the mighty deeds of God in a way that everyone could understand. That's precisely what the Holy Spirit descends upon us to do. Ask Him to come as a tongue of fire to you once again, and He will. Then speak!


