

Dear Friends,

As we listen to the readings this summer, we are treated to numerous agricultural images in the passages from Matthew's Gospel One of the common themes is God's desire for us. The Bible shows that he is equipping us to live as his faithful disciples, even in the face of temptation, distractions and sin around us and often within us.

He equips us in several ways. One is in the power of the Word of God; as the Book of Hebrews states, "the word of God is living and effective, sharper than any two-edged sword" (Hebrews 4:12). Also in the power of the sacraments, first through Baptism, which transforms us into children of a loving Father, and then through the other sacraments, especially the Eucharist, the real and substantial presence of Jesus Christ in our midst.

God also equips us in the Church, in

which the presence of the Holy Spirit dwells and animates us, and in the Apostolic teaching which has been handed down to us.

Origen, a great Father of the Church, wrote, "The angels and servants of the Word will gather from the kingdom of Christ all things that cause a stumbling block to souls, which they will scatter and burn."

PADS Overnight Shelter Reopening This Fall Volunteers are needed to serve the unhoused in our area.

After being closed as an overnight shelter during Covid, there is a need to reopen the doors of the church to the vulnerable and unhoused in the area. The renovation of St. James Church was thoughtfully outfitted to offer a soft place to land on a weekly basis from October through April. We are grateful to be able to offer showers, laundry, and warm meals. This is only possible with consistent, generous support from the community.

St. James PADS will reopen October 2023. We are in need of many volunteers this season. If you worked with PADS in the past, please come back and continue to nourish the spirit of those in need and mentor new volunteers. If you have not volunteered before, please join one of our volunteer teams, and check with your friends to see if you would like to work together on a shift. Many parishioners and others in the community have formed lifelong bonds with their fellow volunteers through this program. Serving others is a connection like no other. The commitment can be as small as four hours per month or as often as you are available.

Shift Volunteers work on either the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, or 4th Wednesday of the month covering 4-5 hour shifts from 7:00 pm -7:00 am. During this time the volunteers monitor and serve the needs of the guests with showers, sleeping arrangements and laundry. Shift Volunteers must be 18 or older, or 16 with a parent. New volunteers will have access to a brief training. **Food Teams** sign up for either the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, or 4th Wednesday of the month to provide and/or serve warm dinner for the guests (signing up to drop off either an entrée, side, or dessert from a given menu).

There will be additional opportunities for small groups, scouts, youth groups, community groups, teams, ministries, etc.
