## "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me."

(Matthew 16:24)

#### Dear Friends,

The great paradox of the Cross is at the very center of our Catholic faith. Jesus transformed this dreadful symbol of condemnation, humiliation and shameful death into the instrument of our salvation. It changes our whole understanding of suffering, which can become salvific when we join our trials to Jesus' own anguish.

St. Paul wrote, "Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church," (Col 1:24).

James Seghers, Catholic apologist and founder of Totus Tuus Ministries, writes this about St. Paul's words to the Colossians:

"...[U]niting our suffering to Jesus' Passion... transforms us into Christ and then flows through us to bring our Lord to others. In these verses we discover another mystery of the Father's love. He chooses to incorporate us into his divine Son and into the Family business of the Blessed Trinity, which is the salvation of souls. St. Paul could 'rejoice' in his suffering because in his surrender he was conformed to his crucified Lord and cooperated with Jesus in the salvation of souls. Here we find meaning in our trials."

In light of this, the Church directs us, "There is also to be a cross, with a figure of Christ crucified upon it, either on the altar or near it, where it is clearly visible to the assembled congregation," (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, par. 308).

The eminent liturgical expert, Bishop Peter Elliott, wrote "the liturgical crucifix... is a sign in the midst of the Eucharistic assembly proclaiming that the Mass is the same sacrifice as Calvary."

We have a beautiful crucifix hanging on the wall of our sanctuary, to remind us of this great act of Jesus' sacrificial love. Soon we will also have a magnificent altar cross, donated by a generous parishioner who wishes to remain anonymous.



## Reflection on this Sunday's Gospel

Isn't it easy to relate to Peter? One moment Jesus announces Peter's deep communion with God the Father. The very next, when he rejects the logic of Jesus' suffering and death, Jesus calls Peter Satan. We Christians shouldn't be too shocked when we experience both spiritual highs and lows, when we perceive breathtaking contradictions in our hearts.

Like the great apostle, you and I are recipients of unfathomable graces. God dwells in us, calls his beloved children, and takes care of our every need. And we also continually fail to embrace our sufferings with trust in Jesus. We know the truth of the creed, but we easily scorn the weight of the cross.

The good news is that, like Peter, we are never abandoned by the Lord even at our worst moments. Peter will eventually learn the beauty of the cross when he is willingly crucified. But it took time for him to get there. And it takes time for us, too. This week let's not be too shocked at these divisions in our hearts but accept them and patiently seek to be more obedient to Jesus' cross-shaped plan for us.
