Dear Friends,

These words from the Book of Sirach, and the words of the parable from Matthew's Gospel: "Then in anger his master handed him over to the torturers until he should pay back the whole debt. So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart." (Matthew 18:35) are some of the most challenging in the whole of the Gospels.

Does Jesus really expect us to forgive those who have hurt us — sometimes grievously? Well, apparently, yes. How hard it is to hear these words from Jesus himself. In my life, I have encountered people who have been exceedingly cruel. I don't want to forgive them. I am sure that I have offended people, and they surely don't want to forgive me.

But Jesus is calling us to another way. This is the tough part. If we do not forgive, we allow the Enemy to claim a place in our hearts where resentment and anger can take root and dominate our thoughts and emotions.

The Lord wishes that we be free of that. Handing all of this righteous anger over to Jesus and asking for freedom from this pain can be a start to interior freedom, where we can encounter the Lord's love more fully.



Holy Hour







Grandparents' Day Prayer




