Dear Friends.

On September 14, 1965, Pope Paul VI established the Synod of Bishops "to make ever greater use of the bishops' assistance in providing for the good of the universal Church" and to enjoy "the consolation of their presence, the help of their wisdom and experience, the support of their counsel, and the voice of their authority."

A synod is described in the Canon 342 of the 1983 Code of Canon Law as "a group of bishops who have been chosen from different regions of the world and meet at fixed times to foster closer unity between the Roman Pontiff and bishops, to assist the Roman Pontiff with their counsel in the preservation and growth of faith and morals and in the observance and strengthening of ecclesiastical discipline, and to consider questions pertaining to the activity of the Church in the world."

To date there have been 16 "ordinary general "synods, including the synod now meeting in Rome, and three "extraordinary general" synods, as well as 11 "special" synods, usually addressing an issue or issues in a particular coun-

try or region. In and of themselves, synods do not have legislative power; rather, they are advisory to the Pope.

The current synod is called "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission." It is not clear to everyone what a "synodal Church means, but it seems that the goal is to discuss more effective ways to increase participation in the Church's mission, and to build communion in the Church.

Please pray for the work of the synod, and ask the Holy Spirit to guide the discussions.



The Loaves & Fishes Ministry provides an evening meal and a brown bag lunch for women at Sarah's Circle. Our ministry operates every Saturday beginning in October and continues through the last weekend in April.

We previously supported the NS Housing men's shelter. Unfortunately, this shelter has temporarily moved to the Midway Airport area. With regret, we are unable to provide support until its return to the Uptown neighborhood. Further information will follow once we receive notification.

Numerous St. James groups prepare lunches and meals, and many families and individuals make lunches, pick up soup and bread and give up their Saturday evenings to deliver food to the shelters. Thanks to all who have helped in the past.

Migrants, refugees and asylum seekers: Who are they, why do they come and how does Catholic Charities help them?

What Does It Mean To Be A Migrant?

Migrants are vulnerable people who are fleeing their country of origin and seeking safety and opportunity elsewhere. The Catholic Church recognizes the right of all nations to control their borders and the flow of migrants within. At the same time, the church recognizes the right of individuals to migrate in search of safety and security, which often means leaving one's country of origin. At the end of 2021, 89.3 million people worldwide had been forcibly displaced. Of those, 27.1 million were considered refugees, 53.2 million were internally displaced (still living within their home country but forced to flee to another region) and 4.6 million were asylum seekers.

Refugee vs. Asylum Seeker

Refugees abroad (many of them living in refugee camps) are designated by the United Nations and the U.S. State Department for acceptance into the country. Refugees are closely supported by a number of entities. They are "documented" migrants. Asylum seekers experience a different process. If they are released into the United States interior by the federal government, asylum seekers will typically be given a Notice to Appear (NTA), the charging document that signals the initiation of removal proceedings against an individual.

Once released from custody, many asylum seekers receive services at a border respite center. Asylum seekers face overwhelming barriers to reach the U.S. and obtain asylum.

Contrary to common misperceptions, asylum seekers are not eligible for federally funded benefits or resources, including the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, Medicaid or public housing assistance.

Employment is not an immediate option. Asylum seekers must wait at least 150 days after filing a complete asylum application before applying for employment authorization.

How does Catholic Charities Help?

For more than 110 years, the Catholic Charities community has recognized the inherent dignity of every person, regardless of where they come from or how they arrived. Catholic Charities agencies offer a continuum of services to those in need. In 2021, Catholic Charities agencies served more than 608,000 vulnerable people on the move via welcoming and integration-specific programming.






