

"Many classics of the horror genre are, at their core, theological."

In our secular culture, October is often associated with Halloween. That's fine, other than the fact that so many people don't realize any longer that it is short for "All Hallows Eve," because it is the night before All Saints Day in the Catholic Church.

To that end, I am reminded of an article I read years ago that explored how the classic horror genre of books and movies – think Brahms Stroker's *Dracula* and *Night of the Living Dead*, not *Twilight* and *Resident Evil* – were, at their core, theological. For example, in the classic genre, zombies represent death, hence, while they moved slowly, the never ceased moving. You can outrun death in the short term but can never escape it.

I don't think that classic horror authors always intended their works to be theological. However, questions such as life and death will always lead to questions about everlasting life; questions about good and evil lean in the direction of God.

The classic genre existed in a Judeo-Christian culture, thus the framework in which the stories came to exist imparted Judeo-Christian themes.


Unlike before, now zombies can sometimes move fast and are at times more intelligent than the slowly moving mindless monsters from before.

Vampires fill an interesting niche. Underneath the classic *Dracula* is a Christian framework: Van Helsing is an agent of the Holy See (i.e. the Vatican) and things such as holy water and the Eucharist are used to combat vampires. Christ is the light in the darkness, having risen from the dead. Dracula represents evil and the rejection of God, and thus is banished to the darkness.

The world of Twilight, in contrast, has a Mormon framework – Meyers is Mormon – and I think explains why vampires can walk about in daylight and so on. (Mormonism has an embedded deification theme different than Christianity.)

This coming All Saints Day, may we seek to be holy and walk in the light of Christ.

Dedicated to bringing compassionate awareness to violence within families & relationships




October 21 & 22, 2023 St. James Gathering Space

 Involvement in any of our ministries or apostolates is a wonderful way to give back to God and strengthen our parish. In today's Gospel reading, Jesus tells us: "repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." This answer, coming in response to a trick question of whether it was lawful for Jews to pay taxes to Caesar, gives us pause.

To be sure, the government has its area of responsibility, so do pay your taxes, stop at red lights, and don't be a terrorist. But what belongs to God? Everything. God created the universe out of nothing; it is his. The government must conform itself to God's laws.

In our lives, we can be tempted to compartmentalize, thinking that we give God his hour on Sunday, but the rest of the week is ours.

Likewise, we tend to think that we can volunteer for a parish group such as the St. Vincent de Paul Society, and then spend the rest of our time the way we want.

We should volunteer and we do have other things to do. Yet, when we volunteer, we are not giving to God and the Church community like we give to Caesar. We are giving back to God what is already, truly his.

So, here is a question to ponder: how am I giving back to God and his Church community what is already his in terms of my talent and abilities?

Feed the Hungry - Loaves & Fishes Ministry

For over thirty years, the St. James community has reached out to the homeless in Chicago's Uptown neighborhood. The Loaves & Fishes Ministry provides an evening meal and a brown bag lunch for women at Sarah's Circle. Our ministry operates every Saturday beginning in October and continues through the last weekend in April.

We previously supported the NS Housing men's shelter. Unfortunately, this shelter has temporarily moved to the Midway Airport area. With regret, we are unable to provide support until its return to the Uptown neighborhood. Further information will follow once we receive notification.

Numerous St. James groups prepare lunches and meals, and many families and individuals make lunches, pick up soup and bread and give up their Saturday evenings to deliver food to the shelters. Thanks to all who have helped in the past.


