An eventful week lies before us. Tuesday is, of course, Halloween, the eve of "All Hallows Day," otherwise known as the Solemnity of All Saints, am important feast day in our Church calendar. The feast has been celebrated at least since the fourth century, and in the ninth century the date was fixed on November 1. We honor and pray to all the saints, those known and unknown. This feast reflects our belief in the Communion of Saints, which we profess every Sunday in the Nicene and Apostles Creeds. By our Baptism, we are made members of this Communion, which includes those baptized on earth, those in Heaven, and those being purified in Purgatory.

On November 2, we mark All Souls Day, a day set aside for prayers for all the faithful departed who are in need of our prayers and Masses for their final purification. That evening we will offer a Requiem Mass at 7:00 pm for all the dead, and especially for those who have been buried from St. James in the past year. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and may the perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. We also offer our deep sympathy to all who have lost a loved one in the past year.



Mass to Honor Veterans





Bereavement Ministry

Compassionate Hearts Are Needed

"We are called to servanthood in the name of God, following the new commandment ~ Love one another as I have loved you." (John Towner, composer).

There are no spoken or written words to adequately define this ministry. Some things can only be spoken in the heart.

St. James Bereavement Ministry serves those who are grieving. The devastation that accompanies losing a loved one can be paralyzing. As bereavement ministers, we walk with those who are grieving, helping them plan the funeral Mass which is a meaningful celebration of the life of their loved one. Perhaps most importantly, bereavement ministers listen to the story of the deceased from those who loved them best. It is a ministry of presence.

Bereavement ministers are trained by another bereavement minister. New ministers "shadow" them until they become comfortable soloing. When a funeral comes into our office, our receptionist emails the information to all bereavement ministers. The first minister who is available sends a response to the office and copies all bereavement ministers. The process of contacting the family begins then. If you have a compassionate heart and would like to join our team, we will welcome you with open arms. For more information, contact the Parish Office at 224-345-7200.




