

Today's Readings

First Reading:

"'I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their kin, and will put my words into His mouth; He shall tell them all that I command Him." (Dt 18:18)

Psalm:

If today you hear His voice, harden not your hearts. (**Ps 95**)

Second Reading:

An unmarried woman or a virgin is anxious about the things of the Lord, so that she may be holy in both body and spirit. (1 Cor 7:34)

Gospel:

The people were astonished at His teaching, for He taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes. (Mk 1:22)



"He taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes."

- Mark 1:22

From the beginning of Mark's Gospel, Jesus reveals His divine authority to the people of Israel. Jesus rebukes the unclean spirit possessing a man in the synagogue and commands that the demon leave the man. The demon obeys. The people's reaction: "a new teaching with authority."

In 1973, the film *The Exorcist* was released and became a sensation. It was based on a 1971 novel by William Peter Blatty. Ironically, this hugely popular film about a girl possessed by Satan, (which received ten Oscar nominations, and grossed \$440 million) was seen by many as just another horror movie. It would seem that people today are even less convinced of the reality of spiritual battle in their own lives.

St. Ignatius of Loyola is recognized as the expert in the discernment of spirits, evil and good. He taught that each desire in our hearts comes from one of three sources – our own desires, the Holy Spirit, or the Evil One. Through his Rules of Discernment, he taught a method of discerning whether these movements are from God or not. Looking around the word, one can see the real spiritual battles raging around us. The supernatural world is real, and intersects with the natural world.

Jesus is Lord! We address Him at every mass as "Kyrie," Greek for Lord. The power of the Name of Jesus is more powerful than anything the demons can attack us with. The grace of the sacraments, especially the sacrament of Reconciliation, is very powerful.

Avoiding the idolatry of the occult, of pornography and sexual immorality, of greed and our own pride, along with a life of prayer, offers God's protection.

Lent begins in less than three weeks. It's not too early to begin preparing to grow in our spiritual lives during the penitential season.




Trivia Night at St. Edna, February 3
