



Assists Neighbors-in-Need

The St. James SVDP Volunteers

Founded at St. James in 2006, our St. Vincent de Paul Conference mission is to serve as a network of friends, inspired by Gospel values, growing in holiness and building a more just world through personal relationships with and service to people in need. We join together to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to neighbors-in-need.

In 2023, our twenty eight volunteers spent approximately 3,280 combined hours and traveled 1,662 miles to fulfill their Vincentian duties of being the hands and feet of Jesus ministering to those in need in our local area. We are grateful for all of our volunteers, including the eight who recently joined us.

We heartfully thank all who have donated to St. Vincent de Paul through Jubilation and your private donations throughout the year. Your generous contributions, including those from Vincentian volunteers, totaled \$61,529 in 2023 and enabled our SVDP Conference to spend \$47,550 helping our neighbors-in-need by:

- Serving at least 100 neighborsin-need within our parish boundaries.
- Providing requested assistance, i.e. grocery store gift cards, medicines, medical bills, car repairs, utilities (electricity, heat, phone), rent or mortgage, insurance, taxes, and gas. We also listened, advised, spoke with and prayed with our neighbors-in-need.
- Helping with partial payments for neighbors-in-need in other parishes to reciprocate their cost-sharing with people within our parish boundaries.
- Paying for four catered evening meals that we assisted in serving to large groups through Catholic Charities in Des Plaines.
- Donating money to assist two other needy parishes and paying our fair share to the Chicago Office of St. Vincent de Paul for operating expenses.

Again, thank you for your generosity and please keep our neighbors-in-need in your thoughts and prayers.

But what comes to a Catholic's mind when we think of Mother? Likely it's the Virgin Mother, shrouded in grace and purity, who comes to the forefront of our minds.

This month we honor and celebrate our Mother, the "Queen of Heaven," or "Queen of May." Mary truly created new growth when she agreed to be the mother of Our Savior, Jesus. Mary strengthens our faith, nourishes it, as a mother feeds a child, to help us grow and continue to praise her son.




