# Gospel:

"Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate." (Mk 10:9) Dear Friends,

Our national election is just a month away. I wrote a couple of weeks ago that I would present Church teaching on the duty of citizens to vote, and how to prudentially make decisions in voting based on Catholic moral teaching.

I will now share what the Church teaches in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC). Bolded numbers refer to sections of the CCC.

**2239.** It is the duty of citizens to contribute along with the civil authorities to the good of society in a spirit of truth, justice, solidarity, and freedom...this requires citizens to fulfill their roles in the life of the political community.

**2240.** Submission to authority and coresponsibility for the common good make it morally obligatory to pay taxes, to exercise the right to vote, and to defend one's country.

A candidate's character, and what the candidate intends to do with political power, is the most important qualification for office. Will he or she, and those associated with him/her in governing, serve the common good? Or, will he or she undermine the common good? Personal moral character is important, as it obviously informs the candidate's appreciation of the moral dimension of public issues, but it is the stated commitment to public policy in keeping with the common good which is the most significant factor.

The worthiness or unworthiness of a candidate for office is therefore best judged by their relationship to the basic principles of a just social order and their willingness to advance them (1906).

Common good is to be understood "the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and more easily."

The Catechism goes on to name among the elements of the common good:

- 1907. the fundamental and inalienable natural rights of human persons,
- 1908. the basic common goods of society (food, clothing, health, work, education and culture, suitable information, the right to establish a family, etc.),
- 1909. the stability and security that comes with a just social order.

Pope Benedict elaborated on these themes to European leaders in 2006, saying,

"As far as the Catholic Church is concerned, the principal focus of her interventions in the public arena is the protection and promotion of the dignity of the person, and she is thereby consciously drawing particular attention to principles which are not negotiable. Among these the following emerge clearly today:

- protection of life in all its stages, from the first moment of conception until natural death
- recognition and promotion of the natural structure of the family as a union between a man and a woman based on marriage, and its defense from attempts to make it juridically equivalent to radically different forms of union.
- the protection of the right of parents to educate their children." \*


# **Calling All Knitters & Crocheters**


Help us keep our unhoused PADS guests and others warmer this winter by creating a winter scarf.
