Dear Friends,

The Google definition of the word apocalypse, "In Ancient Greek, "apokalypsis" (ἀποκάλυψις) means "revelation" or "uncovering." It refers to something being revealed, disclosed, or laid bare, especially in the context of supernatural or divine information being made known."

The final book of the Bible, Revelation, is also known as the Apocalypse. Many people associate the word with destruction or damage on a catastrophic scale. Many interpret this book as predictions or prophecies of the end of the world. But our Catholic understanding of the Book of Revelation focuses on the visions John received of the Heavenly liturgy, of which our liturgy on earth is a foretaste and a reflection.

Pope Leo XIV spoke eloquently last week about the Eastern liturgy, calling attention to the need to recover the sense of mystery expressed in Eastern liturgies; the importance of rediscovering the sense of the primacy of God and of mystagogy; and the need for, "penance, fasting, and weeping for one's own sins and for those of all humanity." He highlighted the

"medicinal" value of Eastern traditions of spirituality that combine, "the drama of human misery with wonder at God's mercy."

A question we can ask ourselves as we attend the Mass and worship God is this: Who is the primary actor in the liturgy? – actor not in the sense of theatre, but in the sense of the One who is performing the action. Jesus is the primary actor in the Mass. His sacrifice of self is made present. He gives Himself lovingly to the Father, and invites us into that sacrificial act. Herein is the mystery, the transcendence, the supernatural which is at the heart of the liturgy.

My hope is that over the coming months we will dive more deeply into this reality of the Church's worship of God, and learn to unite ourselves more intimately with the exchange of love between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. God bless you,



ur readings for this Sunday reveal the radical, countercultural call of Christianity: to live in love and peace—not the superficial kind, but the real, gritty, divine kind.

If being a *hippie* is about love and peace, then Catholics, through Christ, are the *über hippies*. But not by the world's definition. Jesus redefines love as *agape* (self-giving, sacrificial, faithful action), not just emotions or romance. As Jesus says, "Whoever loves me will keep my word," love is obedience rooted in relationship. To love Jesus means choosing daily discipleship - intentional actions, sacrifices, and the humility to love even when we don't feel like it.

This love leads to peace - but again, not the world's shallow version of peace, as in the absence of conflict or a detente. Without addressing underlying issues, such absences quickly end in renewed conflicts. The Hebrew word for peace is *shalom*; it means right relationship, right relationship with God, with oneself, and with others. When there are right relationships all around, then there is true and lasting peace. Jesus is the source of true peace because He is the reconciliation between heaven and earth.

In the second reading's vision of the heavenly city, there's no temple because God and the Lamb dwell with the people. All is in right relationship - perfect peace.

Being Catholic, then, means living out this divine love and peace in a world that worships idols: comfort, consumerism, and self.

True discipleship is countercultural. It's resisting gossip, greed, and indifference. It's

why we gather on Sundays, why we sacrifice, why people should sense something different - right relationship - when they encounter the people of St. James Parish.

Discipleship isn't a trend. It's a revolution of love. In Christ, we are called not to blend in, but to stand out - as the true lovers and peacemakers of the world.

#### **Reflection Questions:**

- How do I actively live out love as an intentional action in my daily life, especially when it's difficult or inconvenient?
- What areas of my life are not in "right relationship" with God or others, and how might Jesus be calling me to restore peace there?
- In what ways am I called to be countercultural as a disciple of Jesus, and how can I more boldly reflect His love and peace in a world that often values the opposite?

## **Devotions, Explained!**

Our Lady of Perpetual Help

Our Lady of Perpetual Help refers both to a title conferred upon the Blessed Mother as well as to a corresponding icon that dates to the late Middle Ages.

Painted on wood, the original icon has a Byzantine style and depicts the Blessed Mother holding the Christ Child. She is flanked by St. Michael and St. Gabriel, who hold the instruments of Christ's passion, including a spear, nails and the Crown of Thorns. In the image, Christ seemingly leans into his mother's embrace for comfort and strength as he contemplates these objects.

The icon is thought to have originated in Crete, but for 300 years was venerated in the Church of San Matteo in Merulana in Rome. Blessed Pope Pius IX entrusted the image to the Order of Redemptorists, who moved it to the Church of St. Alphonsus. He later established the Feast of Our Lady of Perpetual Help on June 27.

Jonathan Haidt's 2024 book entitled "The Anxious Generation" argues that today's kids are marked by significant increases in anxiety, as the title suggests. Smartphones, social media, economic uncertainty, the chaos of a global pandemic, fear regarding climate change, and the so-called "meaning crisis" all contribute to strikingly high levels of anxiety in young people today. I'm a bit older than this generation, but I feel it, too. The world can be too much to handle.

The Gospel this week offers a stunning solution for troubled souls. To his overwhelmed and anxious disciples, the risen Jesus says, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you" (John 14:27). His peace is that of the one who was overwhelmed on the cross and then conquered death by the power of his divinity, his bond of love with the Father. He offers us this unshakeable peace.

Of course, mental illness does not magically disappear because of the risen Jesus. But he does walk with us and offer us his peace in the midst of our suffering. The peace the world gives is not like his because it is weak, uncertain, and self-generated. Jesus' peace is strong, sure, and given as a gift from God. He gives it to us amid our anxiety. Will you receive it as a gift? I hope so. He wants to fill the hearts of this generation with his peace.


