

Jesus warns through the rich man and Lazarus that neglecting the poor leads to torment, while heeding God's Word brings eternal life. Dear Friends,

Last week, a group of parishioners from St. James and from the Diocese of Green Bay, Wisconsin, along with me and Fr. Juan Carlos from Appleton, traveled to Mexico City for a mission trip. We spent five days with Hope of the Poor, an apostolate founded by and under the direction of Craig Johring, an American who has been working with street people in Mexico City for nineteen years.

The overall goal of the mission trip was to see Christ in the poor. We met and became friends with several families who, with the help of Hope of the Poor, have been able to be lifted out of the extreme poverty and hopelessness of life on the streets and all that involves. Those whose lives have been transformed, and who have received hope for their future and their children's futures, are so grateful for the love they have received, and we who met and interacted with them received an immense amount of love from them.

One of the highlights of the trip was Mass at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe, where Fr. Juan and I were able to

concelebrate the Sunday Mass at this place where an extraordinary event took place in 1531, when the Virgin Mary appeared to a local peasant, St. Juan Diego, and helped to bring about the conversion of 9 million Native Mexicans to Jesus and the Catholic faith. I offered Mass for you, the people of St. James.

One of the beauties of Hope of the Poor is that it is not just a social service organization. It is primarily an effort of evangelizing people – of bringing people to an encounter with Jesus Christ. This encounter is life changing, as it shares His love with them through housing, counseling, religious formation, education, drug rehabilitation, and other basics that they need.





Christi Fidelis Award Announcement





Unrequieted Love Presented by Fr. Larry Dowling Wednesday, October 1

Holy Family Catholic Community (2515 Palatine Rd. Inverness) will host a special presentation by Fr. Larry Dowling.

At the heart of this presentation is the collaboration between Mr. Haman Cross III (artist), Fr. Larry Dowling, and the Holy Spirit. The moving artwork, Unrequited Love, depicts a suffering Christ weeping at the weight of systemic racism - the cross our society still carries – yet also yearning for love to bear fruit in racial reconciliation, healing, and reparation. In the words of Fr. Dowling, "The painting is meant to encourage civil, meaningful and courageous conversations on how we as White people unconsciously continue to participate in the original sin of our nation: racism."

Unrequited Love will begin with Fr. Dowling's presentation on October 1 and continue with follow-up Zoom discussions on Wednesday evenings throughout October (8, 15, 22, and 29).
