Today's Readings

First Reading:

Prayer and atonement for the dead express faith in resurrection, trusting God's mercy to cleanse and reward them in the life to come. 2 Maccabees 12:43-46

Second Reading

Believers, led by the Spirit as God's children, await full redemption, sharing Christ's glory as creation itself longs for renewal and freedom.

Gospel

Jesus describes the final judgment: our treatment of the hungry, thirsty, and suffering reveals our love for Him; the compassionate receive eternal life, the uncaring face separation.

Matthew 25:31-46

Dear Friends,

Christian believers live with genuine hope: that after death all sinners are reconciled with God and enter heaven, the state of eternal union with God. Today we observe All Souls Day, the day dedicated to praying for the souls in Purgatory.

We know why Purgatory exists: namely, that even though by the time of death sins have been forgiven, there must be a purging, a purification, of ourselves. As Pope St. John Paul II procaimed, "love...demands purification."

Elise Ureneck, a contemporary scholar who has studied the phenomenon of Purgatory wrote in a 2019 article for the Arlington Catholic Herald:

"So what will it [purgatory] be like? As when speaking about anything divine, we have to rely on image, analogy and metaphor.

According to St. Catherine of Genoa, a mystic known for her vision of purgatory, it will be a type of fire, though not like that used to describe the experience of hell.

'Rust which is sin, covers souls, and... is burnt away by fire, the more it is consumed, the more the soul responds to God. ... As the rust lessens and the soul is opened to the divine rays, happiness grows,' she wrote.

Fire has a lot of effects: light, heat, warmth and destruction. But when a precious metal is placed in its midst, it's purified and perfected."

One of the Spiritual Works of Mercy, praying for the dead is an act of love. As Pope

Benedict XVI said in a talk on St. Catherine of Genoa:

"The first original passage concerns the 'place' of the purification of souls. In her day it was depicted mainly using images linked to space: a certain space was conceived of in which purgatory was supposed to be located.


Catherine, however, did not see purgatory as a scene in the bowels of the earth: for her it is not an exterior but rather an interior fire. This is purgatory: an inner fire.

The Saint speaks of the Soul's journey of purification on the way to full communion with God, starting from her own experience of profound sorrow for the sins committed, in comparison with God's infinite love..."

On this holy day, and in every Mass, we pray for the faithful who have completed their lives on earth. We pray that they will come into the presence of the loving God who created and redeemed them. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and may perpetual light shine upon them.

ANOINTING OF THE SIGK: WHY?

This is the first in a series of four articles exploring the source, meaning, presence and practical implications of the Anointing of the Sick, a Sacrament of the Church that brings us closer to God's mercy. We hope you will find them informative. Let our priests know if you have any questions.



Why does the Church Anoint?

Jesus miraculously cured the sick and empowered his apostles to do the same: "He summoned the Twelve and gave them power and authority over all demons and to cure diseases, and he sent them to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal [the sick]" (Luke 9:1-2). While sickness is not a direct punishment for one's personal sins, it is a reminder of our human condition because of Original Sin. For that reason, and many others, the miraculous cures that Jesus works in and through his apostles and their successors in the Church are a visible sign of hope that he will cure all that ails us, including our sins, granting us everlasting life.

What Scripture Says About Anointing

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is that tangible encounter with Jesus for spiritual and physical healing. We read the following in the letter of St. James (the Less), our patron saint:

Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven. (James 5:14-15)

Who Can Annoint?

The successors of the apostles are the bishops. The presbyters, or priests, are those who cooperate in the bishop's priestly ministry. While diaconal ministry is a very important part of Church life, diaconal ordination does not impart a priestly sacramental ministry, and thus deacons do not anoint.

The Sacrament of Anointing takes place within a liturgical celebration of

prayers and readings, often including a sacramental confession. The sacrament itself occurs when the bishop or priest, laying hands on the head of the person, anoints the forehead and then the palms of the hands saying: (head) "Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit;" (hands) "May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up."

The Form and the Matter

These words are the form of the sacrament, and the matter is the anointing with the sacred oil, called the Oil of the Sick (Oleum Infirmorum). This oil is natural olive oil blessed by the Bishop at the Chrism Mass on Holy Thursday. Though, if needed, the priest may bless the oil during the ritual itself.

Wisdom from the Catechism

The Catechism of the Catholic Church summarizes the effects of the grace of this sacrament:

- the uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ, for his own good and that of the whole Church:
- the strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age;
- the forgiveness of sins, if the sick person was not able to obtain it through the sacrament of Penance;
- the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of his soul;
- the preparation for passing over to eternal life. (CCC #1532)





Bereavement Ministry



The devastation that accompanies losing a loved one can be paralyzing. As bereavement ministers, we help the grieving plan the celebration of life for their loved one and listen to their stories of the deceased.

Our group provides training. New ministers "shadow" a current minister until they become comfortable soloing. When a funeral reaches the Parish Office, an email is sent to all bereavement ministers. The first one who is available sends a response to the office and copies our group. The process of contacting the family begins then. If you have a compassionate heart and would like to join our team, we will welcome you with open arms. Please contact the Parish Office for more information.



Contact the Parish Office (224) 345-7200 as soon as possible when your loved one is dying or has just begun hospice. Please use extension 2 after hours. The Anointing of the Sick may be administered to those dying as well as those who are not dying but are dealing with serious illness, major surgery, or advanced age. (The Last Rites includes Anointing, as well as Confession and Communion.) A person may be anointed more than once if needed.


