Today's **Readings**

Today the Church observes the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. The official name of this church is the Archbasilica of the Most Holy Savior and Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist at the Lateran. It is the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome, and the cathedra, or seat of the bishop, symbolizing the teaching and governing authority of the bishop, is located within. In this case, the bishop is Pope Leo XIV, the Bishop of Rome.

It may seem like an odd feast to be celebrated in the liturgy, but is has a deep significance and importance. Founded in 324 AD, the Lateran is the first public church and basilica in the city of Rome and the oldest in the Western world. In 313 AD, the Emperor Constantine, though not yet a Christian, legalized Christianity in the Roman Empire after many decades of persecution and the slaughter of Christians. For the first time, Christians were able to openly practice their faith without fear of being arrested and imprisoned or put to death.

We enjoy freedom of religion in our nation. Our Constitution ensures this freedom, guaranteeing that government cannot interfere in our religious practice and expression. (Periodically, one of the states attempts to force priests to violate the seal of confession in certain cases, and the courts always rule against this violation of religious freedom. Oregon is the latest state to try this).

Living our religion publicly is a great witness of our faith in Jesus Christ to the people around us. It is not meant to be hidden away in a church building but to be openly shared and proclaimed. Thus we are dismissed from Mass, literally "sent" into the world to sanctify it. Ite, missa est, "go, you are sent."



ANOINTING OF THE SIGK: WHAT?

This is the second in a series of four articles exploring the source, meaning, presence and practical implications of the Anointing of the Sick, a Sacrament of the Church that brings us closer to God's mercy. We hope you will find them informative. Let our priests know if you have any questions.



What is the Anointing of the Sick?

There is much confusion these days regarding the Anointing of the Sick versus Last Rites. Here is an oversimplistic history: over time, the Church focused on giving the sacrament to those who were dying, and hence it became known as Extreme Unction, "unction" being another word for anointing. It was considered part of the last rituals or rites a person received before dying, including confession and communion. After the Second Vatican Council, the Church returned to an earlier Church practice, restoring the use of the sacrament with those who were not necessarily dying, and now calls it the Anointing of the Sick. Its application includes those facing serious illness or advanced age, but not necessarily death. (More on this will follow next week.)

The Church, however, did not "get rid of" the Last Rites; the bishops and priests of the Church still administer rites for people before they die: the Sacrament of Penance/Reconciliation/Confession, the Apostolic Pardon, Viaticum and the Anointing of the Sick. Additionally, a person who has not been baptized may receive the sacrament in an emergency, without the usual preparation.

What Happens During the Last Rites?

As part of the Last Rites, a Catholic is very strongly encouraged to make a good sacramental confession. As the Catechism notes, if a person is physically unable to make a sacramental confession, such as being unresponsive or in a coma, the Sacrament of Anointing does provide for "the forgiveness of sins, if the sick person was not able to obtain it through the sacrament of Penance" (CCC #1532). The required disposition, of course, is repentance, even if the person cannot outwardly express it.

The Apostolic Pardon

The Apostolic Pardon is like the promise made by Jesus to the good thief on the cross, "today, you will be with me in paradise" (Luke 23:43). It is an indulgence for the remission of temporal punishment due to sin, given to a person who is dying and in the state of grace. Hence, it is given after sacramental confession or, if the person is physically unable to confess, after the penitential rite. (For an indulgence to be "plenary," or for the complete remission of temporal punishment, the person must have no attachment to sin; otherwise, it is a partial indulgence.)

Prepared for our Heavenly Homeland

Literally last, but not least, is communion. In Latin, the word viaticum was originally a financial allowance or set of supplies for a journey. After the Sacraments of Penance and Anointing, the dying person is given the Eucharist as food for the journey to encounter Jesus face to face. It recalls Jesus' own words, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day" (John 6:54). In the words of the Catechism:

Thus, just as the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist form a unity called "the sacraments of Christian initiation," so too it can be said that Penance, the Anointing of the Sick and the Eucharist as viaticum constitute at the end of Christian life "the sacraments that prepare for our heavenly homeland" or the sacraments that complete the earthly pilgrimage. (CCC #1525)





It's that time of year again

start thinking about getting the yearly Influenza Vaccine

The CDC recommends that everyone 6 months of age and older, with rare exceptions, receive an updated 2025-2026 flu vaccine to reduce the risk of influenza and its potentially serious complications. Anyone can get sick with influenza, but it can be more dangerous in vulnerable populations such as infants, young children, pregnant women, and those immunocompromised or with certain health conditions such as asthma, diabetes, or heart disease. It can cause mild to severe illness and at times can lead to hospitalizations and even death.

A few things to know about the flu vaccine:

- The CDC recommends the 2025-2026 seasonal flu vaccination with singledose formulations (that are free of thimerosal as a preservative) for children, pregnant women, and adults.
- · Everyone should receive a flu vaccine suitable for their health status and age. Ask your healthcare provider about available flu vaccine options for you.
- Adults age 65 and older are very susceptible to complications of the flu and are recommended to receive an influenza vaccine specifically formulated for that age group.



Other Important Vaccination Information:


There are vaccines to prevent more than 30 life-threatening diseases and infections, helping people of all ages live longer healthier lives. Immunization currently prevents 3.5 million to 5 million deaths every year from diseases like diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough), influenza and measles.

As the late Pope Francis said: "Vaccination is a simple but profound way of promoting the common good and caring for each other, especially the most vulnerable" and "being vaccinated with vaccines authorized by the competent authorities is an act of love...Love for oneself, love for one's family and friends, love for all people."

Contact the Parish Office (224) 345-7200 as soon as possible when your loved one is dying or has just begun hospice. Please use extension 2 after hours. The Anointing of the Sick may be administered to those dying as well as those who are not dying but are dealing with serious illness, major surgery, or advanced age. (The Last Rites includes Anointing, as well as Confession and Communion.) A person may be anointed more than once if needed.






