Dear Friends,

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, there is a clear shift in the focus of our Scripture readings. As an example, look at today's first reading and Gospel passage. From the Book of Malachi and Luke Chapter 21, there are warnings of coming troubles – famines, plagues, earthquakes as well as persecution and death at the hands of enemies. The End Times are coming at some point, says the Lord, but only the Father knows when this event will occur.

In the Gospel, Jesus first gives clear instructions to the disciples:

"See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end."

Yet, in his mercy and wisdom, the Lord next makes these promises to his followers:

"I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute. But for you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays. Not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives." Looking forward to the completion of the church year (on the Feast of Christ the King next weekend) we can turn our hearts and minds to these truths of our faith: that as believers our perseverence will ultimately gain us eternal life.

On another note, thank you to all who attended and supported Jubilation, our annual parish gala last weekend. Through your generosity, we raised much-needed funds for school tuition assistance, helping make Catholic education possible for all who desire it. The PADS Shelter which provides emergency housing also benefits from this event. Finally, our St. Vincent de Paul chapter, serving those in dire financial situations, receives a generous portion of the proceeds.



ANOINTING OF THE SIGK: WHAT?

This is the third in a series of four articles exploring the source, meaning, presence and practical implications of the Anointing of the Sick, a Sacrament of the Church that brings us closer to God's mercy. We hope you will find them informative. Let our priests know if you have any questions.

Do Not Wait to Call

If you remember one thing from reading this article, please remember this: do not wait until the last minute to call for a priest to anoint your loved one who is dying. In the previous two articles, it was explained that while the Church still administers the Last Rites for the dying, the Church has restored a broader practice of the Anointing of the Sick in general. While a priest will do everything possible to arrive in time to anoint someone facing imminent death, it is prudent to call for a priest sooner if a loved one has a serious condition or is entering hospice.

The Ritual Book for the Anointing itself specifically notes:

"Great care and concern should be taken to see that those of the faithful whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age receive this sacrament. A prudent or reasonably sure judgment, without scruple, is sufficient for deciding on the seriousness of an illness; if necessary a doctor may be consulted."

Beneficial in Many Situations

The anointing is not for trivial illnesses such as a cold, or for routine outpatient procedures. Yet, "a sick person may be anointed before surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery." A person facing serious surgery, cancer, multiple sclerosis and the like, should be anointed. If the sick person recovers, but falls ill again, he may be anointed again. The same applies if the sick person's condition worsens; he or she may be anointed again.

Additionally, the elderly may be anointed because they have grown weak with the burden of years, even if they are not seriously ill.

The one case in which a priest cannot anoint is when the person has already died. Sacraments are specifically for the living. When there is doubt if the person is deceased, the priest may confer the sacrament conditionally. When death has occurred, the Church does provide rituals and prayers for the deceased, even right there at home or at the hospital, including a blessing of the body.

Give Your Loved One Time to Prepare

Again, as stated at the beginning of this article, please contact the Parish Office as soon as possible when your loved one is dying, or has just begun hospice. Sometimes family members are concerned that the sight of the priest celebrating the Anointing of the Sick will frighten the dying person. That is understandable, yet, the person often realizes that he or she is dying; the struggle is often, at least in part, the family's acceptance of it. A person who is dying should be given the time to prepare to meet Christ face to face, including a sacramental confession with the Apostolic Pardon, as well as Viaticum.

Help Bring Beauty to Our Worship Space!



Contact the Parish Office (224) 345-7200 as soon as possible when your loved one is dying or has just begun hospice. Please use extension 2 after hours. The Anointing of the Sick may be administered to those dying as well as those who are not dying but are dealing with serious illness, major surgery, or advanced age. (The Last Rites includes Anointing, as well as Confession and Communion.) A person may be anointed more than once if needed.


