A Reading from the Gospel of John

John (the Baptist)...looked at Jesus as he walked, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. Jesus turned, and saw them following, and said to them, "What do you seek?" And they said to him, "Rabbi" (which means Teacher), "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come and see."

John 1:35-42

Dear Friends,

One of the two disciples in this passage of John's Gospel is Andrew, the brother of Simon

Peter, who then went to his brother and told him, "we have found the Messiah." The Messiah, or the "Anointed One," was the anticipated and longed-for savior promised by God to the people of Israel, who presented him to the entire world.

Have you been searching for Him? Do you feel a draw to the Catholic faith? Have you been looking for Truth and meaning beyond what the world has to offer? On September 8, we begin our process for those who are interested in the Catholic faith and would like to learn about it in more depth. It is a process of exploring God's plan for the world and the human race, His revelation in His son Jesus Christ, and the reality of the church Jesus founded to carry out his mission of offering salvation to the whole world.

This process is called "OCIA," which stands for "Order of Christian Initiation of Adults." This is a long and perhaps confusing way of describing learning about Jesus and the Catholic faith with the goal of receiving or completing the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist (Communion).

If you are a seeker, curious, or seriously interested in the Catholic faith, or even a Catholic desiring to deepen your understanding of the faith and your relationship with Jesus and His Church, this is for you! We meet on Tuesday evenings at 7 pm in the Laramie Room in the lower level of the church, beginning September 8 and going until Easter. A firm commitment to becoming Catholic is not required until you are ready.

So, consider joining a group of fellow seekers and come join us. All materials are provided, and there is no charge. 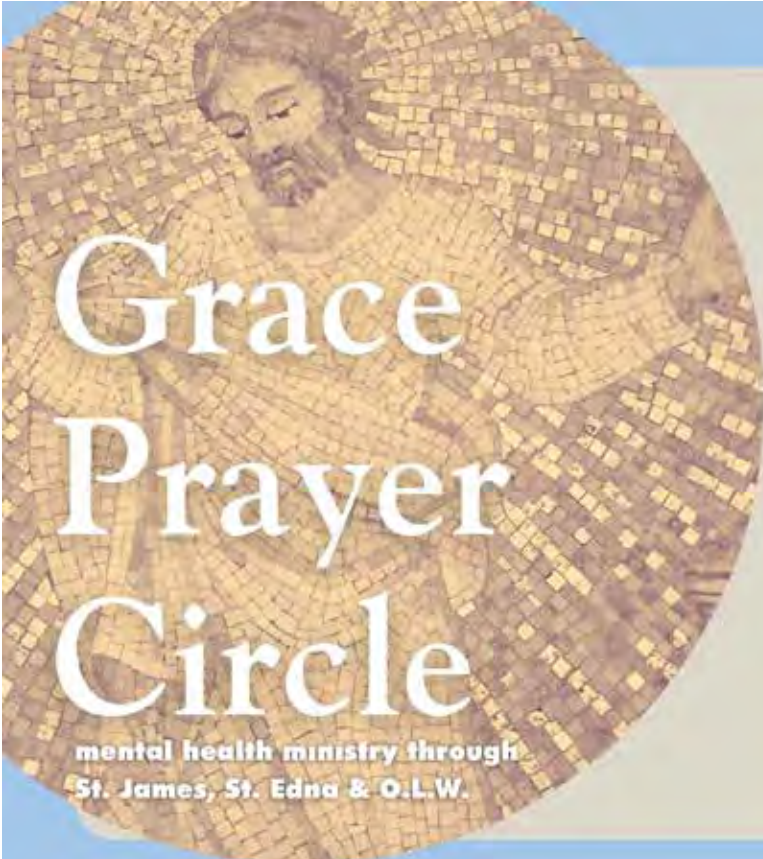

PATH TO SUNDAY

August 2, 2026 • 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Have you ever noticed that we are never completely satisfied? This idea appears everywhere in our culture. The Rolling Stones famously sang, “I can’t get no satisfaction,” while U2 admitted, “I still haven’t found what I’m looking for.” Advertisements build entire campaigns around this same truth, convincing us that the next car, phone, or product will finally make us happy. Yet no earthly possession can satisfy the deepest longing of the human heart because we were created for something greater—we were created for God.

Similarly, we are all hungry, though not simply for food. Our hunger is much deeper. Consider how many people continue eating long after they have received enough nourishment. We often consume more than we need because we are trying to fill an emptiness that food cannot satisfy. The reason is simple: our hunger is ultimately for God. As St. Augustine wrote in his Confessions, “Thou hast formed us for Thyself, and our hearts are restless till they find rest in Thee.” God created us for Himself, and only a relationship with Him can fill the infinite desire within us. The prophet Isaiah asks, “Why spend your money for what is not bread, your wages for what fails to satisfy?” Christ came not only to save us from sin but also to unite us with the Father, making it possible for finite people to receive the infinite God.

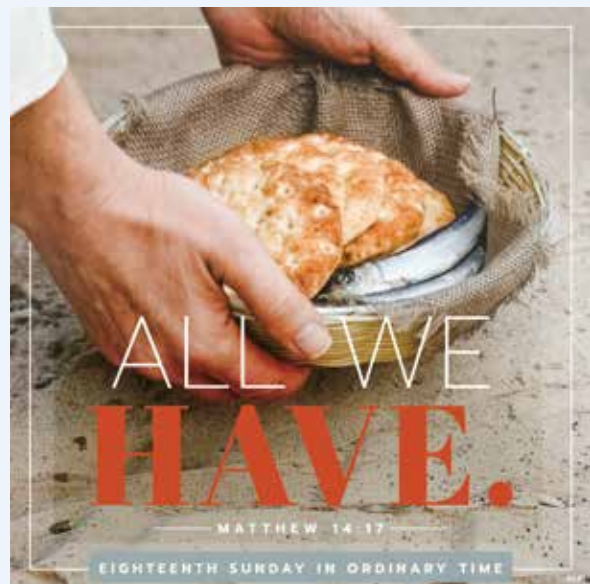
This is why we come to church. The Church is not merely a social club or charity organization but the People of God, called together to receive Christ. In the Eucharist, Jesus feeds us just as He fed the crowd in the Gospel by blessing, breaking, and distributing the bread. Every Mass reminds us that Christ alone satisfies our deepest hunger. If we truly

seek lasting joy, we must turn to Him in the Eucharist, in prayer, and in Scripture, trusting that He alone can fill our hearts with lasting peace.

Reflection Questions:

- What are some things in your own life that you have looked to for lasting happiness, and have they truly satisfied you? Why or why not?
- If our deepest hunger is for God rather than for material things, then how should we understand success and happiness, contrary to how our culture understands them?
- If the Eucharist is Christ's way of satisfying our deepest spiritual hunger, how can you prepare yourself to participate more fully in Mass and grow closer to Him throughout the week?

WEEKLY STEWARDSHIP RECOMMENDATION:

Consider zero-waste options for picnics, BBQ and camping meals. Reusable items add a touch of class, sensibility and can significantly reduce waste. Use lightweight reusable plates, utensils, bowls, cups and cloth napkins. Get creative with packaging. Reusable containers? Of course. What about Mason jar desserts? Go heavy on finger foods: cut vegetables and mixed nuts. Wipe off food when finished and use a washable cloth bag to hold used dinnerware for dishwashing later. Reserve a bag for recyclables and a container for compostables. If you must go disposable, use biodegradable paper products instead of plastic. Ditch the straws. Use a large thermos for drinks. Take other beverages in metal or glass containers and recycle. Skipping bottled water saves money and the environment.
