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Today's Readings

First Reading

God removes Shebna and appoints Eliakim, giving him authority and responsibility to serve as a faithful leader over God's people.

Isaiah 22:19-23

Second Reading

God's wisdom and knowledge are beyond understanding; everything comes from Him, exists through Him, and returns to Him.

Romans 11:33-36

Gospel

Peter declares Jesus the Messiah and Son of God; Jesus blesses him, establishes the Church, and gives Peter authority.

Matthew 16:13-20

On the base of the dome of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome, in six-foot tall letters, the following is inscribed: "Tu es Petrus et super hanc petram aedificabo ecclesiam meam et tibi dabo claves regni caelorum" These are words of Jesus in Matthew 16:18, from today's Gospel. "You are 'Rock' (Peter) and on this rock I will build my Church, to you I will give the keys of the kingdom of heaven."

One of the questions which often arises in OCIA and religion classes regards the difference between the Catholic faith and other Christian communions or denominations. The understanding of authority is one of the major differences. Matthew 16 and John 20:19-23 (Jesus...said to them, "Peace be with you... As the Father has sent me, even so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.") both recount Jesus handing this immense spiritual authority to Peter and the Apostles. The power to teach authoritatively and to retain or forgive sins in the name and person of Jesus is both humbling and astounding. It is one of the foundations of the Catholic Church.

Does this mean that every thought, utterance or opinion of the Successor of St. Peter, the pope, must be believed by every baptized Catholic? No! That is called hyperpapalism. The Church teaches that the Bishop of Rome, the man who sits in the Chair of Peter, has binding, but limited authority to teach definitively and authoritatively. There are strict criteria:

The pope must be speaking *ex Cathedra* ("from the Chair) by virtue of his supreme Apostolic authority; He defines a matter of faith or morals as pastor and doctor of all Christians.

In such a case, he is possessed of that infallibility with which the divine Redeemer willed that his Church should be endowed. Therefore such definitions of the Roman pontiff (the pope) are of themselves, and not from the consent of the Church, irreformable.

This is the charism (gift) of papal infallibility, by which the pope is protected from error in such teaching. This gift was given to St. Peter, and is handed down to his successor to the present day. Invoked very rarely, it is nonetheless an important cornerstone on which Jesus founded His Church.

PATH TO SUNDAY

August 23, 2026 • 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Beneath St. Peter's Basilica in Rome lies one of Christianity's most fascinating archaeological discoveries: a first-century necropolis and, according to the Catholic Church, the tomb of St. Peter, the apostle and first Pope. Excavated in the 1940s—even during World War II and the Nazi occupation of Rome—the site can still be visited today through the Vatican's Scavi tour. Above it stands the basilica's main altar, built directly over Peter's tomb. The Catholic Church really is built on top of St. Peter!

But why Peter? When Jesus asked his disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" Simon answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus replied, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah," explaining that this truth had been revealed to him by God. Then Jesus gave Simon a new name: "You are Petros and upon this rock I will build my church."

The Greek word Petros is literally the word for "rock," and is translated into English as "Peter." Peter eventually went to Rome, where he became the leader of the Christian community and was martyred. His successors, as bishops of Rome, came to be understood as successors to Peter.

Jesus also gave Peter "the keys to the kingdom of heaven," granting him a unique responsibility to teach, govern, and preserve the Church's unity. Those keys refer to the power and authority of the official representative of the king in Israel. This representative, in older times called a vicar, functioned like a modern-day chief of staff, who controlled access to the King and spoke for him. We see this in Isaiah 22:20-22, "On that day I will summon my servant Eliakim, son of Hilkiah; I will clothe him with your robe, gird him with your sash,

confer on him your authority. He shall be a father to the inhabitants of Jerusalem, and to the house of Judah. I will place the key of the House of David on his shoulder; what he opens, no one will shut, what he shuts, no one will open." This does not mean every Pope, as the successor of St. Peter, is a saint or that everything a Pope says is infallible? No. Papal infallibility is narrowly defined, concerning faith and morals under specific conditions.

So why have a Pope? Ultimately, Catholics believe it is because Jesus gave Peter—and his successors—a special role: to keep the Church united and faithful to Christ.

Reflection Questions:

- What does Jesus calling Peter "the rock" and giving him "the keys to the kingdom" reveal about Peter's role in the Church?
- Why do you think the Catholic Church believes that the Pope, as Peter's successor, has a special responsibility to preserve the Church's unity and faithfulness to Christ?
- How does learning about St. Peter's tomb beneath St. Peter's Basilica deepen your understanding of the connection between the early Church and the Catholic Church today?
